**RULES:**

- An exhibitor may show three Market Wethers and three Club Lamb Breeding Ewes for a maximum total of six.
- Club Lamb Breeding Ewes do not have to be nominated for Tulsa in order to show at the Oklahoma State Fair®. Ewe lambs must have a flock tag and a scrapie tag in ear at time of show.
- All market ewes must have lamb's teeth with no visible signs of permanent teeth.
- All ear tags from previous shows must be removed.
- Minimum weight is 85 pounds with no maximum weight.
- There will be no official weigh-in of market ewe lambs. Scales will be available for weighing. The exhibitor will provide a weight, on the official weight card, to the Superintendent.
- Upon completion of each class, the superintendent will weigh a minimum of the top five ewes. Any ewe, which has gained more than 5 pounds from the weight listed on the official showing card, will be disqualified.
- Artificial coloring, paint or powder will not be permitted on market lambs.
- The use of hydration utensils and the use of soft muzzles are permitted in the stalls only. Soft muzzles must be removed from the lambs any time they are taken from their stall for any reason. Failure to use hydration utensils and soft muzzles in the stalls will constitute in disqualification.
- All market ewes must be slick shorn above the knees and hocks. Must be shorn, a maximum of two weeks prior to arrival on grounds.
- Superintendent will divide market ewes into weight classes, as evenly as possible, with no breed classification.
- Ewe lambs are not eligible to show with Market Wethers.
- **Exhibitors must show in clean pressed jeans, clean shirt with collar and club emblem (4-H or FFA). 4-H and FFA jackets are acceptable but not required. T-shirts, tennis shoes, and headwear are not allowed.**
- All accounts of owner must be in financial good standing to be eligible to enter the show ring. Any and all monies will be applied to entry and show fees before being applied to exhibitor admission tickets.

**PREMIUM INFORMATION:**

Class premiums based on the number in each class:

- 10-14 head - \$60, \$50, \$40, \$30, \$30
- 15 or more head - \$60, \$50, \$40, \$30, \$30, \$30, \$30, \$30, \$30

Division & Overall:

- Grand Champion Market Ewe Lamb - \$500
- Reserve Grand Champion Market Ewe Lamb - \$250

Also may purchase Season Pass for \$25.00 good for all 11 days.
- Exhibitor will receive an armband(s) with Junior Entry.
