**RULES:**

- The Maine-Anjou division is open to cattle recorded in the herd book of the Maine-Anjou Association, 528 Livestock Exchange Bldg., Kansas City, Missouri 64102.
- All exhibitors are subject to the rules and regulations of the Oklahoma State Fair® (OSF) and the American Maine-Anjou Association. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation or not abiding by the show rules will be disqualified from showing.
- All animals must be registered in the AMAA and the original certificate must be inspected before the show.
- All animals must be 25% to 5/8% Maine-Anjou or greater.
- Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and correspond with the registration certificate.
- The surgical or non-surgical alteration or conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
- The use of false tail heads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
- The dyeing or artificial changing of the overall natural color of any animal is prohibited. Coloring agents may be used on the legs and tail switches, but none may be used above the flank.
- All animals must be dehorned.
- All cattle shall be made available for veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering. Cattle will also be made available for a veterinary examination and be mouthed for the purpose of age verification. Those cattle found to be questionable in the opinion of the veterinarian, may be removed from the show or moved to a different class at the discretion of the Show Committee.
- Exhibitors of heifers 20 months of age or older must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian available for inspection. A copy of the registration papers showing all ownership of animal must accompany an entry of each animal.
- Bulls exhibited at 20 months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
- Bulls six months of age and older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
- At the discretion of the superintendent, classes may be split if entries warrant.
- All accounts of owner must be in financial good standing to be eligible to enter the show ring. Any and all monies will be applied to entry and show fees before being applied to exhibitor admission tickets.

**PREMIUM INFORMATION:**

- The OMAA will pay 20% of premiums.
- Premiums will be paid in all classes except division and overall championship classes.
- Individual Class Premiums: \$50, \$30, \$20, \$10, \$5
- Group Class Premiums: \$40, \$30, \$20

**ENTRY INFORMATION:**

- Owner's W-9 form must be included with entry.
- Substitutions can be made on existing entries for \$10.00 per sub and must be made in the Livestock Show Office by 4:00 PM the day before the show.

## FEES:

- **Required**
  - \$35.00 per head (if postmarked or entered online by August 15)
  - \$70.00 per head (if postmarked after August 15 & by September 1)
  - \$105.00 per head (if postmarked after September 1 & by 4:00 PM the day before the show)
- **Additional**
  - Equipment permit - \$30.00
  - Additional Tickets (pre-order for immediate family members) \$7.00 adult single day ticket, \$4.00 child single day ticket (ages 11-6) or an Exhibitor Ticket Bundle (4 single day tickets) for \$20.00 if postmarked by September 1, 2011. Also may purchase Season Pass for \$25.00 good for all 11 days.
  - Exhibitor will receive an armband(s) per the scale in the Open & Junior General Livestock Rules.

Calf entries in the cow/calf classes may be shown individually providing individual entry has been made. Cows may be evaluated and screened out of the show on the basis of an unsound utter. The determination of the show committee will be final. The Champion Cow/Calf Pair will be eligible for the Female Championship.
