## PARTICIPANT GENERAL RULES

### ADMINISTRATIVE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as OSF), through its authorized officials, reserves the final and absolute right to interpret and enforce its own rules and regulations, and to settle and determine all matters, questions and differences connected with or incidental to the Oklahoma State Fair (OSF).
2. OSF reserves the right to amend or add to these rules, as they deem necessary. In the event of a conflict regarding general or special rules, the latter will govern.
3. Every exhibit/animal must remain at OKC Fairgrounds (hereinafter referred to as OKCF) until the specified release time. Gatekeepers and other OSF employees are instructed to report any person attempting to remove exhibits or livestock before the release time and date specified for that particular contest or event unless the manager gives special written permission.
4. No dogs or other pets are permitted at OKCF, whether on a leash or not. Only bona fide service dogs, trained animals in scheduled acts, OSF competitions and police dogs are allowed. Violations could result in a \$50 fine, impounding of the animal and/or expulsion from the OSF.
5. OSF does not permit the use of balloon displays, inflatable decorations, public address systems, electronic amplifiers, gongs, bells, and other noisy instruments are not permitted without prior approval. Distribution of helium-filled Mylar balloons is not allowed under any circumstances.
6. No person will be permitted to distribute or post advertising matter, handbills, fliers, or heralds at OKCF without prior written approval from the OSF in the form of a contract, and then only from within the contracted space. OSF can demand the removal of any advertising matter it considers objectionable.
7. All space is owned and designated by OSF. Management reserves the right to reassign any space, stall or pen not occupied by the exhibitor on the specified date. No exhibitor will be allowed to sublet or sell any space, privilege, stall, or pen without written permission from the OSF. No exhibitor will be allowed to sell or trade entries with exhibitors not entered in the show.
8. Admission each day requires the display and verification of an outside gate admission ticket or armband purchase. Re-entry requires a hand stamp and the armband or ticket stub.
9. Failure to comply with these rules and regulations will cause forfeiture of premiums and privileges and be considered sufficient cause to bar said exhibitor from future participation at the OSF.
10. Firearms: Per Oklahoma State Statute Title 21, Section 1290.22 (D) 3, carrying a concealed or unconcealed firearm is prohibited at the OKC Fairgrounds during the Oklahoma State Fair. This restriction extends to any person, regardless of their professional licensing, occupation, or jurisdiction.

### NON-LIABILITY TO EXHIBITORS AND PATRONS

1. All property of every character entered for competition, display or any other purpose, or brought to OKCF, by any person, shall be subject to the rules and regulations prescribed by OSF.
2. In no case, shall the OSF, its Board of Directors, officers, agents, representatives, servants, or employees be held responsible for any person coming to OKCF for damage, injury, death or disability by disease, theft, or any other cause.
3. OSF hereby refuses to assume any responsibility for the safety, as bailee or otherwise, of any property brought to OKCF.
4. If the property owners, or others interested in the property, desire protection against loss, damage or injury from fire, or any other cause, must make their own arrangements and pay for such insurance.

### CLAIMS FOR INJURY

1. OSF expressly refuses to assume any liability for injuries to any patron coming to OKCF, and no claims for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, or suit initiated or maintained against OSF, its Board of Directors, officers, agents, representatives, servants or employees for said cause by any person having license or privilege to exhibit at OKCF or occupying any space thereon, and it is part of the consideration for such license or privilege that such claims for damage are specifically waived.
2. If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be caused by reason of negligence or willful act of any person, firm or corporation, other agent, representatives, servants, or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on OKCF property. OSF shall, in no manner, be responsible therefore, and in



case to be subjected to any expense or liability, all persons causing same or liable therefore shall indemnify the OSF.

#### TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

1. Notice is hereby specifically given that in admitting vehicles to OKCF, whether those of exhibitors or patrons, and in permitting the bringing of any other property to OKCF, OSF does not assume any responsibility therefore, or accept the custody thereof, nor assume the personal control thereof in any manner.
2. No motorcycles, ATV's, bicycles, skates, segways, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters or any other powered or non-powered device of a similar nature will be permitted into the OSF operating area (except for ADA needs).
3. Proper credentials are required at all times for access to parking and inside the OKCF.
4. Passenger vehicles and trailers will be directed to the appropriate parking facilities. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas will be reported to OSF police and subsequently towed and/or impounded. The owner or driver may be required to pay towing charges to recover the vehicle.

#### ADMINISTRATION OFFICES

1. OSF and staff maintain headquarters in the administration building (3001 General Pershing Blvd). The various superintendents have their stations in the respective department buildings. For the duration of the OSF, the equine and livestock staff will maintain headquarters in the designated areas of the livestock and equine barns.

#### REMAINING ON GROUNDS OVERNIGHT

1. Overnight parking for motorhomes, recreational vehicles or living quarter trailers is restricted to the RV lots at OKCF. Please visit the OKCF website for current information.

## LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES and REGULATIONS

### ELIGIBILITY

- Junior Show Eligibility:** All Junior Show exhibitors, other than the divisions noted below, must be a bona fide member of an official 4-H Club or FFA chapter in the United States.  
**4-H ELIGIBILITY:** Youth may enroll in 4-H on August 1 if they are 8 AND in the 3rd grade on September 1. If they turn 8 after September 1 and are in 3rd grade, they will not be eligible to enroll in 4-H until the next 4-H year, but they may participate as a Cloverbud. When a child turns 9, they may join as a 4-H member regardless of grade level. 4-H membership ends on July 31 following the completion of the 12th grade, equivalency of 12<sup>th</sup> grade, GED or having reached the age of 19 on or before September 1, whichever comes first. Graduated high school seniors may complete their 4-H career by exhibiting in the fall fairs. A 4-H member's enrollment status must have been "active" the previous year to exhibit in the fall fairs.  
**FFA ELIGIBILITY:** Any student in grades 8-12 must be regularly enrolled in a year-long course of study in agricultural education at school in order to be eligible to participate in any FFA activity. Students in the seventh grade are not eligible for FFA membership in Oklahoma.
  - **Junior show exceptions:** Division 1007 Junior Brangus; Division 1021 Junior Miniature Hereford; Divisions 1300-1303 Oklahoma Youth Meat Goat Association Shows; Divisions 1401-1412 Youth Commercial and Breeding Gilts; and Division 1600 Open Llama/Alpaca.
  - **Youth show exceptions:**
    - Division 1007 Junior Brangus Show: Refer to age restrictions as defined by the National Junior Brangus Show rules available at <https://junior.gobrangus.com/national-junior-brangus-show/>.
    - Divisions 1300-1304 Oklahoma Youth Meat Goat Association: Refer to age restrictions as outlined at [www.oklahomameatgoatassociation.com/oymga.html](http://www.oklahomameatgoatassociation.com/oymga.html).
    - Divisions 1401-1409 Youth Commercial and Breeding Gilts: 4-H/FFA membership is not required. Youth exhibitor's age, as of day of show, must be between the minimum 5 years old and the maximum 20 years old.
    - Division 1600 Llama/Alpaca Show: 4-H/FFA membership is NOT required to enter this competition. Refer to the specific competition guide for age requirements/division.
- Youth who have been declared ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities by their local school administration will be declared ineligible to participate in OSF shows. Youth who are eligible on the first day of the show will be considered eligible through the duration of the OSF. Similarly, youth who are considered ineligible the first day of the OSF will be considered ineligible for the duration of the show. If an exhibitor is ineligible to participate in the OSF for any reason, including rules of the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activity Association (OSSAA), the animals owned by the exhibitor are also ineligible. Ineligible youth who participate in the show, forfeit all show premiums and awards, and will be subject to disciplinary action as provided by the local school policies. It will be the responsibility of the local school administration to notify OSF management if a particular student is ineligible to participate.
- Attire:** It is expected all exhibitors dress neatly with pride and in tradition with each show/division when presenting their animal(s). Exhibitors who are 4-H/FFA members showing in any division must dress in clean pressed jeans, clean shirt with collar and club emblem (4-H/FFA). 4-H/FFA jackets are acceptable but not required. T-shirts, tennis shoes and headwear are not allowed. No 4-H/FFA emblem can be worn by an exhibitor not enrolled in 4-H/FFA.
- Junior and youth livestock exhibitors must have continuously owned, and personally cared for, their animals since July 1 of the current year for all breeding beef, dairy, sheep, swine, and goats.
- For all breeding animals, exhibitors must have registration papers in their own name and be able to produce the originals, no copies. Registration papers must be transferred to the name of the exhibitor by July 1 of the current year.
- Any animal that has been sold at a premium auction at any other show preceding the OSF is not eligible to be exhibited.
- Animals that are owned jointly or fed on a partnership basis with an adult are not eligible to show in the junior or youth livestock shows at the OSF. 4-H/FFA exhibitors must be the sole owners of any animal they show in the junior or youth livestock shows.
- Junior and youth exhibitors may enter the open shows, for those breeds offering open shows, by filling out the appropriate forms and payment of applicable fees, except where otherwise noted. See the appropriate open division competition guide for entry fees, class schedules, etc.



## ENTRY PROCEDURES, REQUIREMENTS and REFUNDS

NOTE: CHANGES IN ENTRY PROCESSING DEADLINES AND LATE FEES:

The online entry process will open July 1, 2021 and close September 14, 2021 and **all entries must be processed online** (i.e., no manual/hand copy entry forms) with the following stipulations/exceptions:

1. **July 1 – August 15:** Entries processed and paid online. (No late fees applicable)
  - Any **entry changes or additions made after August 15** to entries previously submitted will be assessed additional late fees as noted below.
2. **August 16 – August 31:** Late fees: Entries will be assessed \$100 additional per exhibitor.
  - Entries processed after August 31 will not be eligible for exhibitor armbands, discount tickets or additional parking passes and exhibitors will need to pay admission upon arrival.
3. **September 1 – September 14:** Late fees: Entries will be assessed \$150 additional per exhibitor.
4. **September 15 – until 4 p.m. the day of the earliest published check in of the intended show.** Must be submitted via hard copy/entry forms complete with all necessary paperwork and fees directly to the Livestock Show office. These entries will be assessed an additional late fee of \$200 per exhibitor and all fees must be paid with credit card or cash. No entries will be accepted after 4 p.m. the day of the published earliest check in of the intended show.
5. Entries in Junior shows made by the school ag teacher may be paid via a school check remitted no later than August 31. **Check or accompanying note MUST indicate the exhibitor(s) which that check is being remitted for and the amount applied per exhibitor.**
6. No personal checks will be accepted after August 31.
7. Entries for 4-H/FFA Non-Livestock competitions close at midnight on September 14 with no additional penalty as noted above. Entries must be made online.
8. A legible and accurate **W-9** form must be submitted to the Livestock Show Office on or before September 26 for all payees who anticipate cumulative premiums may exceed \$599. It should be made clear as to which exhibitor account(s) the form is to be associated. Oklahoma State Fair, Inc is not responsible for procuring this document. Premiums may be forfeited if a correct form is not received by the deadline. You may fax this document to the attention of the Livestock Dept. at 405-948-4129; mail to the address given below in #9 or present in person to the Livestock show office.
9. Any other required forms, which may include the completed waiver, may be submitted by:

  - Presenting in person to the Livestock Show office upon arrival and check in. Must be submitted to the Show Office prior to entering the show ring for competition.
10. If funds submitted are returned by the bank or declined for any reason, the entry is subject to cancellation. There will be a \$30 service charge on all returned checks. If payment is non-negotiable by the entry closing deadline noted herein, entries may be considered late and subject to additional late fees. Any outstanding balance due to non-negotiable checks or denied credit cards must be paid via cash, cashier's check, or money order. OSF has the right to ban any exhibitor from future participation should there be a continuous problem with fees from an exhibitor.
11. **Waivers/Liability Releases:** Oklahoma State Fair Waivers/liability releases must be completed in entirety inclusive of signature(s) of all exhibitors and handlers participating in the Oklahoma State Fair and the **legal guardian or parent** of each youth participant 18 years of age and under. The signature of Ag teachers/leaders/agents or trainers will not be accepted in lieu of parent's or legal guardian's signature. Said document must be completed prior to or immediately upon arrival at OKCF and submitted to the Livestock Show office prior to any competition
12. Exhibitors make entries with the distinct understanding that their stock must be brought to the show ring for judging at the request of the superintendent or announcer. Any exhibitor refusing to do so, without just cause, when requested by the superintendent in charge, may forfeit any premium money previously won, and may also be required to remove their stock from OKCF within six (6) hours, after such refusal, possibly barring them from further showing at the OSF.
13. Refunds for voluntary scratched or entries will not be granted. Desired refunds for entries scratched or cancelled due to exhibitor or animal injury or illness must be submitted on the appropriate cancellation form, to the livestock show office no later than 4 p.m. on the day prior to the first affected class/show. (Contact OSF Livestock Show Office for the appropriate form). No refunds will be issued for processing fees, stalls, pens, space and/or admission tickets. For refunds of entry fee overpayment: refunds on

entry fees will be considered with completion and submission of OSF Credit Refund Request form. No refunds of less than \$10 will be issued.

14. Entry into any OSF event/show automatically authorizes the use of any photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses, procured while in attendance, of any individual or group associated with any livestock/animal so entered or involved in competition or exhibition at the OSF. Exhibitors are not allowed access to the static photographer's backdrops or stations without prior receipt of express permission from the appropriate OSF contracted photographer.
15. **Animal Substitutions:** Unless otherwise defined in the individual breed/species competition guide, the following policies apply to substitution of entries:
  - Must be submitted in writing with the completion of a substitution form and payment of any applicable substitution fees.
  - Substitutions will only be accepted for animals of the same breed/species, gender and owned by the same exhibitor/owner as indicated on the original entries. Proof of ownership and substitution fee must be submitted to the livestock show office no later than 4 p.m. on the day before the affected class.
16. **Gate Admission allocation scale and policies:** Armband(s), according to the scale below, will be issued to each exhibitor paid in full for entries in open, junior or youth livestock shows. **EXCEPTION:** Llama/Alpaca Show, Division 1600, and Rodear Cattle Dog Competition: See individual Competition Guides for those competitions for admission information. Armbands must be worn by the exhibitor for entry through the livestock gate. Loose, damaged, or non-fitted armbands will NOT be accepted for entry. Lost armbands will not be replaced. Armbands are dated and good for admission, and re-admission, through the livestock gates during operating hours on the dates printed on the band. The armband admission scale is per exhibitor, not per junior, youth, or open show:

#### ARMBAND ADMISSION SCALE

1 to 2	head entered:	1 armband
3 to 5	head entered:	2 armbands
6+	head entered:	3 armbands

17. The livestock show office will be located southeast of the Jim Norick Arena in the Super Barn and be open from 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. each day of the OSF. The telephone number in that office is 405-948-6717.

#### EXHIBITOR DUTIES and PRIVILEGES

1. The use of any drug or chemical compound that is not approved by the FDA for use in meat animals is prohibited. The illegal administration of approved drugs and compounds is also prohibited. All animals entered in the OSF are subject to blood, urine, and tissue tests by the OSF, FDA and USDA for illegal substances and substances that exceed the acceptable levels established by the USDA, FDA, FARD and EPA. A positive test will result in disqualification.
2. The exhibitor will assume full responsibility for any violation of regulations related to drugs and medications to include withdrawal times and the condemnation of carcasses due to drug rule/regulation violations.
3. Exhibitors are required to keep their spaces or stalls clean. All trash must be placed outside the buildings in a designated area. The aisles and passageways must be kept clear. No demonstrations, trophies, decorations, signs, banners, advertising matter or exhibits of any kind are allowed in the aisles or public passageways.
4. For your convenience, feed and bedding is available at OKCF. Feed and bedding is located west of Barn 7 and Gate 7. Call the Feed and Bedding office (405-948-6786) for current prices. It is permissible for exhibitors to bring their own feed and/or bedding, only straw or course shavings, but absolutely no deliveries, bulk or otherwise, from any other supplier may be made to OKCF during the OSF.
5. OSF management may prohibit an exhibitor or exhibitor's employee from competing or exhibiting due to any rude conduct toward an award committee, judge, superintendent, or any official of the OSF.
6. If it is ascertained that any exhibitor has made, or caused to be made, any false statement regarding any exhibit, or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, he/she shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting.
7. Gatekeepers and policemen are instructed to restrain any person from exiting the gates, attempting to remove stock or other exhibits outside of the gate hours indicated herein or without a written release authorized by the management. Any exhibitor removing an animal or exhibit before designated release



time may be barred from future competition in the OSF and may forfeit any and all premiums and/or awards earned.

### PREMIUMS and AWARDS

1. All classes **with one/single entry (entered, shown, and judged) will be eligible for the class entry/per head fee (only) as premium whenever a Premium is indicated.**
2. No premiums will be issued until OSF receives all funds from all sources. Premium payouts vary by species/breed. See the specific breed information in the division listings. See Rule 8 under Entry Procedures section above with regard to submission of W-9s.
3. In paying premiums, no evidence of award will be recognized unless the judge and superintendent have properly signed the judging results.
4. Premiums will only be awarded to classes in the premium list and as noted.
5. The judge’s decision shall be final, and no appeal will be considered except in case of protest.
6. Only two (2) places per class, per exhibitor [ownership entity] will be paid. Group classes and futurities are excluded. Individual animals shown in group or herd classes must have been entered and shown in one (1) of each of the classes for single animals in open show competitions.
7. The following colors will be used in designating awards:

Champion: royal purple	Reserve Champion: lavender
First Place: blue	Second Place: red
Third Place: white	Fourth Place: pink
Fifth Place: yellow	Sixth Place: dark green
Seventh Place: light green	Eight Place: brown
Ninth Place: gray	Tenth Place and over: light blue

8. It is the responsibility of the payee to file, in writing, claim for lost or incorrect awards/premiums/prize money no later than November 1, 2021. It is also the exhibitor/payee’s responsibility to ensure the livestock office is in receipt of a valid and legible W-9 prior to the end of the OSF. Prize money in excess of \$599 will not be processed or paid without a valid W-9 being on file in the livestock show office.
9. Exhibitors will not be allowed to enter the ring with an outstanding debt or without having submitted the Oklahoma State Fair Liability waiver in entirety, complete with the appropriate and requested signatures. In the event that an exhibitor does show while still owing money, OSF reserves the right to deduct money owed from any premium money the exhibitor is awarded.
10. Management reserves the right to withhold any premiums awarded in case of violation of any rule governing the OSF.

### PROTESTS AND APPEALS

1. Any protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$250, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests must be filed with the OSF management within five (5) hours after the award was made. The award is considered “made” when a ribbon or premium card is placed.
2. Protests must contain at least one (1) specific charge, stating at length the facts or rule violated. The protest must list witnesses, with contact information, to substantiate the charge.
3. Management will not consider any complaint or appeal based upon the statement to the effect that the judge(s) are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article.
4. The right of an exhibitor to appeal the decisions of a judge to management will lie only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit, or when it is charged that the decision of the judge(s) has been influenced or interfered with by another.
5. All questions, disputes or differences not provided for under these rules shall be referred to management, whose decision shall be final.

### ARENA/BARN RULES

1. OSF management will assign all stalls. Exhibitors making entries and not exhibiting will forfeit all fees paid for stalls, pens, space, or admission tickets. No stalls will be used for any purpose other than to stall competing livestock and those stalls that have been assigned to accommodate breed association booths. **Exhibitors placing animals or equipment in any stalls not assigned specifically by OSF management may be expelled from the property, forfeiting any fees paid.** Management reserves the right to return entries when stall or tie out numbers are full.

2. The use of electric, open flame or space heaters is prohibited. Cooking or any heat/flame food preparation is not allowed in the barns.
3. All fans used in the livestock area are to be attached in the following manner:
  - Beef/Dairy: All fans must be hung securely above the tie area or on the stall. No fans will be allowed to operate from the center aisle or side aisle alley. Personal Port-a-Cools are prohibited.
  - Swine/Sheep/Goats/Other: Fans must be attached to the pens or on a pedestal in the pen. No fans will be allowed to operate from any position in the center aisle or in the side alley aisle. There will be no cords across the center aisle and the user must tape down any cords used in the alley.
4. Any electrical equipment used in the barns must conform to manufacturer's specifications. Management strongly urges the use of fans with a three-wired ground plug. All electrical cords must be Underwriters Approved (UA).
5. Any form of penetrating nails, staples, tacks, screws, wire, fasteners, etc., as well as permanent tape, adhesives, glues, paints, or other markers/marketing materials is prohibited. Any damage or alteration caused by the use of any of these types of items will be charged to the exhibitors and may be cause for expulsion from OKCF. Flyers, advertisements, or any other documents cannot be posted anywhere other than on the specific bulletin boards in the barns, other than those for exclusive use by OSF management.
6. Management will assign tie outs for beef cattle in designated areas only, as space allows.
7. Wash animals in wash racks only. Do not wash animals in stalls, walkways, streets, or any other non-designated area.
8. Transfer animal waste from the stall to poly carts and return poly carts to main aisle, if moved.
9. Immediately remediate any spills of animal waste during the transfer process and place all spilled animal waste in bins.
10. OSF is committed to maintaining a tobacco-free environment in all its buildings, barns, and arenas. The use of all tobacco products (including cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, cigars, pipes, and smokeless tobacco) is prohibited except in specifically designated areas.
11. **Fire regulations:** The area around the exhibit buildings and barns must be kept free of motor vehicles. Roping off or blocking of aisles in the barns is prohibited. This includes: blocking aisles with drapes or other obstructions. Exit doors shall not be blocked with any type of equipment (generators, hay, vehicles) even if overhead doors are open. No combustible materials are allowed in any barn. Designated fire lanes must be kept clear. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas will be towed away and subject to recovery of the towing fee from the owner.

**OKC CITY FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE SPECIAL EVENTS FIRE AND LIFE SAFETY FOR LIVESTOCK:**

1. There shall be NO plastic or vinyl material in the barns, covering for stalls, or used for temporary security of retail vendor booths.
2. NO TWO (2) CONTINUOUS STALLS PER AISLE, SHALL BE COVERED AT ANY TIME.
3. Only stalls for tack storage, entertainment, or resting can be covered on the top, and will require a working smoke detector. (See #4)
4. The stalls can only be covered in a red rosin construction grade paper or butcher block paper, cheesecloth, either regular or restaurant type grade, or 100% cotton sheet.
5. Any stalls that are covered containing electrical appliances, (refrigerator, microwave, coffee pots) are required to have an operating smoke detector.
6. Any aisle space between stalls can be covered only if equal open space to material does not exceed **4 feet**. If your material is maximum **4 feet**, then the open space between the materials shall be a minimum of **4 feet**.
7. Combustible storefront or stall fronts **shall** be treated in ACCORDANCE WITH NFPA 701 to make them flame retardant and a certificate or similar proof is supplied to the Fire Marshal's Office prior to its application. Material that is being treated by user must be done in the presence of an Inspector from the OKC Fire Marshal's Office.
8. No portable heaters of any type are allowed in the Oklahoma City Fairgrounds livestock facilities.
9. Awnings shall not extend out from stalls any further than **4 feet**.
10. **NO** tents or canopies are allowed inside the barns, arena, or livestock areas, unless they are NFPA 701 certified. This includes but no limited to EZ-UP style pop up tents.
11. **NO SMOKING** will be permitted in any arena(s) or Livestock area(s) or barns.
12. **NO** hay, straw, shavings, or similar combustible materials used for decorations are permitted within any facility unless they have been treated in ACCORDANCE WITH NFPA 701 to make them flame retardant and a certificate or similar proof is supplied to the OKC Fire Marshal's Office prior to its



application. (Hay or straw for animals is permissible and can be kept in stall areas for feeding and/or bedding).

13. Combustible trash shall be removed at least once a day during the period the arena/exhibit is occupied.
14. **NO PROPANE CYLINDERS** that have LPG in them are allowed inside any public assembly area without approval/permit from OKC Fire Marshal's Office.

#### ARRIVAL/PARKING INFORMATION (**NOTE CHANGE IN GATE 7 CLOSING TIMES IN 2021**)

1. Animals duly entered in the OSF can be brought to OKCF via Gate 7 (3466 Black Gold Drive, Oklahoma City 73107), accessible off Portland Avenue on the west side of OKCF. Gate 7 operating hours are: Wednesday, September 15, 2021 from 12 p.m./noon until 10 p.m., and for the remainder of the OSF, September 16 – 26, from 6:30 a.m. until 10 p.m. Valid health papers, as required for each species, must be presented to the Animal Health Inspectors upon arrival at Gate 7. No animals will be allowed entrance without said documentation and inspection.
2. **MANDATORY:** Copy and **bring the EXHIBITOR INVOICE**, which is emailed to the exhibitor, to present at Gate 7 upon arrival and again at the livestock show office. Information on that document will determine how many people can be admitted upon initial arrival. Additional passengers, guests, family members, etc., must purchase and/or present admission tickets upon arrival each day.
3. Only vehicles with entered animals or a one-time delivery of heavy equipment will be allowed through Gate 7. Please do not contribute to the congestion surrounding the barns by attempting to drive in with passenger vehicles. Vehicles with animals coming in for the first time will be given a "sticky note" allowing initial entrance at Gate 7 by the attendants, which must be affixed to the inside windshield on the driver's side. This form must be clearly evident while the vehicle is in the immediate area of the barns and while unloading animals and/or equipment. Unattended vehicles will be towed at the expense of the owner/exhibitor. Make sure to receive this form from the Gate 7 attendants. Affix the livestock parking hangtag, available for exhibitors in the livestock show office, in your vehicle immediately upon receipt and before you proceed to any parking lot.
4. The Exhibitor Invoice **must** additionally be presented to the livestock show office upon arrival to acquire admission tickets, armbands, and parking passes. Exceptions: Llama/Alpaca and Rodear Cattle Dog competition exhibitors. Parking passes are offered one (1) per registered exhibitor and are for parking of one (1) vehicle with trailer in the livestock parking area south/west of the barns or without a trailer, vehicle only, in any other permit/paid lot. This permit is not good for gate admission, and it does not guarantee a parking place and will be issued for the period of time surrounding the dates of entered exhibition only. The purchase of one (1) parking pass, limited to one (1) additional per exhibitor entered in OSF managed competitions, per week of competition, can be made with online entries processed and paid by August 31, 2021. The cost is \$15 and is subject to the same restrictions and duration as noted herein. Subject to availability and rules as stated on the hangtag. Additional parking options for passenger vehicles only are:
  - Parking: Single day parking, subject to availability and to be paid upon arrival; \$10 per car/per day; accessible from 10<sup>th</sup> Street, May Avenue and Reno Avenue. (\$5 per vehicle/day if purchased prior to September 16).
  - Season parking pass: available for purchase at the Jim Norick Arena Box. Purchased prior to September 16: \$30, purchased after September 16: \$50. Good for all 11 days of the OSF. No refunds will be made for any single day parking paid before purchasing a season parking pass.

## ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

OSF is committed to the humane treatment of all animals exhibited. Every possible precaution is taken to ensure the animals' safety and wellbeing. Any exhibitor found using unethical practices or mistreating an animal at the OSF will be immediately removed from the premises and reported to the proper authorities. All privileges will be withdrawn, attraction fees will be prorated, and premiums will not be awarded.

### ANIMAL EXHIBITS, SHOWS AND COMPETITIONS

It is the responsibility of the owner/exhibitor/handler/agent for each animal being brought to OKCF to be aware of and adhere to the most current rules and regulations regarding animal transportation, disease control, vaccinations, and health documentation requirement, in accordance with the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, Animal Industry Services. For the most current information, call 405-522-6141 or access the Animal Industry State Veterinarian – ODAFF (ok.gov) and scroll down to the section for Animal Movement and Importation.

Any animal not cleaned or fitted to show as a true representative of the breed it represents shall be disqualified, and the judges will not award premiums on such animal. Exhibitors are requested to see that their attendants are neatly and appropriately dressed when their animals enter the show ring. Herdspersons are requested to present an attractive and appealing barn exhibit(s), by keeping their stall areas neat and clean, keeping the spectator walkways clear of all straw, feed, etc., refraining from cooking in the barns, keeping audio equipment at a low volume, following any fire and life-safety rules, and maintaining positive behavior at all times.

- A. **Summary of Program:** Exhibitors show animals for many reasons. The exhibition provides education to the public about livestock and farm animals, as well as the overall agriculture industry. Competition in the show ring provides a forum for comparison of livestock animals, based on selected or desired characteristics and genetics. The results contribute to breed and overall species improvement. These selected characteristics reflect in the market and usually follow consumer demand for a certain type of product, example: leaner meat. The Fair also provides advertisement for the breeders and owners of the animals. The 4-H and FFA programs and other junior organizations, teach valuable skills to youth, such as, finance management, responsibility, decision making and leadership.
- B. **Education:** The OSF has several educational exhibits and programs designed to educate, entertain, and inform the public about livestock and agriculture. The Fair utilizes judging commentators during the livestock shows to involve and inform the public about what is taking place in the show ring. Commentators cover what the judge is looking for in the animals, judging terminology (or “reasons”), as well as fun and educational information about the judged animals. The junior livestock exhibitors display educational exhibits in the livestock area during the Fair. The Fair has a special livestock exhibit area designed to provide species diversity and special education.
- C. **Livestock Exhibits**
  1. Exhibitor Guidelines
    - a) The Fair expects exhibitors to be knowledgeable about exhibit rules, about their projects and always to be prepared to answer questions. The exhibitor's role is that of an ambassador.
    - b) Exhibitors should learn additional details about animals and their roles in society. For example: it is fun and interesting to share by-product uses and other facts with the public. The Fair encourages educational exhibits in barns.
    - c) The Fair expects the exhibitors to cooperate with the AgriBusiness department, assistants, barn crews, the Fair management, and any appointed volunteers. The Fair also expects good sportsmanship, conduct and open communication.
    - d) Notify the AgriBusiness department if there is a confrontation with animal activists, or if there is someone approaching exhibitors and asking questions that make the exhibitors uneasy. Also notify the AgriBusiness department if someone who is unfamiliar or looks suspicious is taking photographs or video footage of the animals.
  2. Livestock Exhibit Guidelines
    - a) Keep the needs of the animals as the number one priority with regard to the following:
      - Food and water are clean and fresh.
      - Stalls are clean, with fresh bedding, and free of debris and waste.
      - Animals are clean and well groomed.
      - Transportation is safe and clean. Use care when loading and unloading.

- Stalls have enough space to prevent crowding, fighting or discomfort.
  - Animals are tied in the stalls with enough slack in the rope so they may lie down.
  - Use proper grooming techniques and equipment when preparing the animals for showing, to cause the least amount of discomfort to the animal.
  - The management will not tolerate any practices deemed inappropriate, unethical, or inhumane. Report any sick animal immediately to the proper authority who may suggest that the exhibitor contact a veterinarian.
- b) Feed shall be appropriate for the animal's age, weight, and species. Exhibitors should read all feed labels for appropriate use and portions. Adhere to all proper withdrawal times if using medicated feeds. Follow the requirements of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) dosages and withdrawal times of drugs, *see Drug Residue Policy*. The Fair prohibits any unnatural, inhumane weight control prior to weigh-in.
- c) Exhibitors should know the proper use of all equipment and exhibit safety awareness. This includes removing equipment from walkways, so it is not a hazard to people or animals. Tack areas, stalls, pens, and cages shall be neat and clean, with equipment put away in tack boxes or stored out of the way. Exhibitors shall use all equipment for approved and legal uses only.

## EQUINE SHOWS AND COMPETITIONS

USDA AND APHIS (Animal and Plant Health Inspection Services), under the Horse Protection Act, which prohibits making a horse sore to enhance its performance, regulate horse shows. OSF also regulates horse shows regarding prohibited substances and the drugging of horses. USEF members and affiliated shows are subject to the rules and industry review program administered by the United States Equestrian Federation. Shows may also be subject to standards set by the individual breed associations, when and if applicable.

## ANIMAL ATTRACTIONS AND EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS

Fair management contracts and supervises animal attraction and educational exhibits. Both animal attractions and educational exhibits are required to provide educational material about their animals and their care to the public. Fair management encourages interaction with the public. This may be a criterion for issuing a contract.

Prior to opening to the public, a Fair designated veterinarian may inspect each animal exhibit. The veterinarian may also make periodic checks throughout the Fair. Each animal exhibit will designate a representative to be responsible and to be available during the Fair operating hours to answer questions, talk to the media or respond to an emergency.

### A. General guidelines for care

- 1) Exhibit staff shall be available at all times. Signs will be posted informing the public of acceptable behavior in any petting facility.
- 2) The staff should be familiar with basic animal husbandry practices.
- 3) Keep animals groomed and clean at **all** times. Keep feed and water receptacles clean and free of debris. The exhibitor will clean animal stalls or pens daily. Properly dispose manure and used bedding in the appropriate receptacles or areas. Replace old bedding with fresh material.
- 4) Alternate and give rest periods to the animals especially during hot weather. The resting pens and working area shall have shade with proper ventilation.
- 5) Feed animals a nutritionally balanced diet as appropriate and with consideration to the animal's age, weight, and species. Water regularly when working and have clean water available in resting pens.
- 6) The facility operator should make an effort to control flies in the exhibit and resting areas. Proper and prompt disposal of manure and used bedding is beneficial to this effort.
- 7) Exhibitors shall use all equipment for approved and legal uses only. The management will not tolerate any practices deemed inappropriate, unethical, or inhumane.
- 8) Report any sick or injured animal immediately to Fair management, who may suggest that the exhibitor contact a veterinarian.
- 9) All animals are required to have a current, within 30 days, certificate of veterinary inspection. Many species are required to have negative tests against certain diseases. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to contact the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry at 405-522-6141 or <http://ag.ok.gov> to make sure all required testing has been performed.

- B. Animal Petting Facilities  
The design of an animal petting facility should help educate the public about different types of animals and animal care while regarding the animals' basic needs, including time away from the public. It should also provide the rare opportunity for contact and interaction with animals. Petting zoos may feature exotic animals not typically raised on farms.
- C. Pony Rides
- 1) The ponies should have a pad or cushioned surface such as lawn or shavings to prevent ponies from walking on the ground or asphalt for extended periods.
  - 2) The pony ride should be a safe site, away from potential, unexpected noises, and sudden movements.
  - 3) Alternate the ponies to allow for reasonable rest periods.
  - 4) Water the ponies regularly.
  - 5) Do not expose the ponies to sun for extended periods without breaks for rest, shade, and water.
  - 6) All equine are required to have a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (within 30 days) and a current negative Equine Infectious Anemia test (within 12 months).
- D. Pig Races
- 1) Pig races provide fast-paced family entertainment and crowd interaction. The USDA regulates pig races and requires an exhibitor license for performing animals. Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry requires certificates of veterinary inspection, and negative tests for brucellosis and pseudorabies for pigs to enter the state. The owner/operator of the pig races may need to produce current, and correct, copies of all CVIs and results of blood tests as requested by OSF management, or in compliance with their contract. The owner/operator of the pig races may need to produce current, and correct, copies of all licenses as regulated by the USDA. Operator should maintain itinerary or schedule of OSF dates to document past and future exhibitions. Pig races shall follow the general policies outlined in this manual, as well as the appropriate feed for the piglet's age.
- E. Other Animal Exhibits (not previously listed)
- 1) It is up to the exhibitor of animal attractions including: any owner exhibiting animals doing tricks or shows; carnivals and concessionaires who exhibit regulated animals; anyone who uses regulated animals to promote or advertise goods and services; animals used to promote photographs or photography; and anyone exhibiting farm animals for nonagricultural purposes to have knowledge of and obtain in a timely manner any required licenses.

## ANIMAL CARE

### POLICY DISCIPLINE AND VIOLATION NOTICE

- A. Fair Management relies on staff members, volunteers, exhibitors, and the public to report any situations that may be potential policy violations.
- B. Fair Management will investigate and determine the severity of all complaints and concerns.
- C. If there is a violation of the Animal Welfare Policy, the exhibitor will receive a verbal warning and the steps needed to correct the violation.
- D. With a second violation, the exhibitor will receive a written violation notice and Fair Management may call the Humane Society or veterinarian, at the exhibitor's expense, depending on the severity of the violation. The removal of animals and/or exhibitor from OKCF may become necessary.
- E. A record of the verbal violation warning, and copies of the violation notices will become part of the exhibitor's file. Fair Management will consider these before issuing another contract.
- F. Any other public or staff complaint filed will become part of the exhibitor's file. Exhibitor will receive copies.
- G. Fair Management reserves the right to disqualify any competitive exhibitors in violation of the animal care policy from any awards and premiums.

## HEALTH and SANITARY REGULATIONS

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Requirements regarding vesicular stomatitis (VSV)

Any livestock (equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae) entering Oklahoma from a county where vesicular stomatitis has been diagnosed within the last thirty (30) days or a county that contains a premises quarantined for vesicular stomatitis shall be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection dated within five (5) days of entry containing the following statement: "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from signs of vesicular stomatitis and have not originated from a premise which is under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis."

### OVERVIEW

1. The State Board of Agriculture provided the following rules and regulations to the Fair. These rules will govern admission of livestock at the OSF.
2. An official of the Animal Industry Division, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, will be present during livestock entry times and will check all Certificates of Veterinary Inspection required under the following regulations.
3. The Animal Industry Division, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, must validate all Certificates of Veterinary Inspection before animals are given stall or pen space in the barns.
4. An official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must accompany all show animals. The official CVI must be issued within 30 days of arrival and shall be available at all times to the representatives of the Animal Industry Division. All out-of-state livestock, including domesticated poultry, birds and rabbits must meet Oklahoma's import requirements. Import requirements may be obtained by going to Animal Industry State Veterinarian – ODAFF (ag.ok.gov) and scrolling down to the link to the Animal Movement and Important section.
5. All animals must be free of infectious, communicable, or contagious disease and if such disease is found, it will be cause for removal of the animal(s) from exhibition.

### CATTLE

1. Cattle must be accompanied by an official CVI, issued within 30 days of arrival that shows complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed, and individual identification, such as tattoo or ear tag. It also must show the animals are free of external parasites, ringworm, warts and any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. Cattle from out-of-state are required to have an official USDA identification tag as required by the Federal Animal Disease Traceability rule.
2. No tuberculosis (TB) test is required for beef or dairy cattle from Oklahoma.
  - **Out-of-state beef breeds:** 18 months of age and older must originate from a TB free state, a TB Accredited Free Herd or must be TB test negative within 60 days of arrival at the show.
    - Areas not Tuberculosis Free as of June 1, 2021 are the Michigan counties of Montmorency, Alpena, Oscoda, and Alcona.
  - **Out-of-state dairy breeds:** 18 months of age and older must originate from a TB free state, a TB Accredited Free Herd or must be TB test negative within 60 days of arrival at the show.
    - Areas not Tuberculosis Free as of June 1, 2021 are the Michigan counties of Montmorency, Alpena, Oscoda, and Alcona.
  - Any sexually intact dairy animal 6 months of age or older changing ownership within the state of Oklahoma is required to have a negative TB test within 60 days before change of ownership. If you have any questions or concerns you may call the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry Animal Industry Services at 405-522-6141 for definite regulations.

### SHEEP and GOATS

1. Must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. The CVI must show the animal to be free of any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease, and include a statement indicating the animal to have been inspected and found free of scabies and other external parasites. All sheep and goats must be individually identified with one of the following:
  - Official USDA ear tag
  - Official breed registry tattoo or microchip, (only if animal is accompanied by a registration certificate).

**ILLEGIBLE TATTOOS WILL BE CONSIDERED AS NO IDENTIFICATION.****SWINE**

1. Must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, (CVI), processed and issued within 30 days of the date of arrival at OKCF, that shows official individual identification by an 840 electronic tag, complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed, and also that they are free of external parasites, ringworms, or warts, or any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. **All swine must have a premises ID listed on the CVI.**
2. **In-state swine** must have a negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies after June 1, 2021 or be from a Validated Brucellosis/Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd and be exhibited by the owners and/or immediate family members. The last quarterly test date (July test) must be listed on the CVI.
  - **Breeding gilts** should be quarantined and retested 30 days after the show before being commingled with other breeding swine.
  - **Out-of-state swine** must have a CVI, an entry permit, proof of negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies within 30 days of entry to the fair or be from a Validated/Qualified Herd with verification of the last quarterly test within 3 months and be identified with an official individual USDA Ear Tag.

**DOGS**

1. Must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
2. All dogs over 3 months of age must have been officially vaccinated against rabies within 12 months of arrival. All dogs must have been vaccinated against distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis, and parvovirus within the previous 12 months.

**LLAMAS and ALPACAS**

1. Each animal must be accompanied by an individual Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), stating that the animal is free of infections and contagious disease within 30 days before arrival at the show.

**EQUINE**

All horses and other equine must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or valid Extended Equine Certificate of Veterinary inspection showing age, breed, sex, and markings to positively identify the animals, including all vaccinations, date and result of required tests, and issued within 30 days of arrival and an official document verifying a negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia showing a test date within 12 months prior to exhibition. Nursing foals less than 6 months of age, accompanied by their negative tested and documented dams, are exempt from test requirements. The laboratory conducting the test must be approved by APHIS, USDA. Both aforementioned documents must clearly identify the animal(s) listed and be presented upon arrival before the animals can be admitted to the grounds or unloaded from the transport vehicles. Any horse/pony/equine arriving without the above-defined documentation will not be allowed entrance onto the grounds or into the barns.

## SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS

Believing it is in the best interest of all livestock breeders to maintain a reputation of integrity and to continue to present a wholesome and progressive image in the show ring, the following list of practices are considered unacceptable in the presentation of livestock. The use of such practices or procedures is, therefore, considered a violation of the rules and regulations governing the OSF.

The following list of practices are considered unacceptable in the presentation of livestock:

1. Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
2. Treating or massaging any part of the body internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant or other substance to temporarily straighten a weak back or loin or to produce unnatural animation.
3. Minimizing the effects of crampiness by feeding or injecting drugs, depressants or applying packs, or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment exempting normal exercise.
4. Striking the animal to cause swelling.
5. Surgery or other procedure performed to change the natural process of growth, maturation, contour, or appearance of any animal, to include teeth, is prohibited. Not included is removal of teats or horns, clipping and dressing of hair, and trimming of hooves.
6. Insertion of foreign material under the skin.
7. Any attempt to change natural color of an animal, either purebred or crossbred, by changing the color or adding false hair, fleece or skin at any point, spot, or area of the animal's body.
8. The use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or administered as a drench.
9. The practice of artificial filling by pumping or any other device is prohibited.
10. Administration of a drug, of any kind or description, internally or externally, prior to entering the show ring, except for treating a recognized disease or injury and for tranquilizing bulls that may otherwise be dangerous or females in heat. For the purpose of these rules, the term "legal drug" shall mean any substance, the sale, possession or use of which is controlled by license under federal, state, or local laws or regulations and any substance commonly used by the medical or veterinary professions. The use of any chemical and/or compound that is not approved by the FDA for use in meat producing animals and the illegal use of approved chemicals and/or compounds are prohibited. All animals shall be subject to tests for foreign substances that exceed the acceptable levels established by the USDA, FDA, or EPA. A positive test will result in disqualification, forfeiture of any premiums and/or awards, and will exclude the exhibitor from future competition at the OSF. Licensed veterinarians will administer all medications only.
11. Balancing the udder by any abnormal means including the use of a mechanical contrivance or injection of fluid or drugs. Setting the teats and/or occluding, sealing the ends, with a mechanical contrivance or with the use of a chemical preparation. Treating or massaging the udder or its attachments with an irritant or counterirritant. The use of common products such as fly spray, ointment, or liniment in excess to the extent that it is irritating is included as an irritant unless required to reduce edema at the time of calving.
12. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, or other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during or after the event may result in an individual or group being expelled, placed on probation, declared ineligible, or barred from exhibiting at the event.

Any violation of the rules and regulations designed for the individual shows or the show ring code of ethics may result in forfeiture of all premiums and awards, disqualification, expulsion or probation of the exhibitor, organized group, individual or livestock involved. Probation, disqualification, expulsion, or other disciplinary action of OSF management will be final. Such action will require application for readmission under such terms as OSF management may prescribe before the group or individual is allowed to exhibit at future events.

The OSF is a member of the following show support organizations: North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association; and International Association of Fairs and Expositions. Violations at this show may affect the eligibility of the individual, group or sponsoring organization from participation at other shows that are also members of these organizations. The names of anyone in violation will be released to the other Fairs and Expositions.

#### **RULES (in addition to the Oklahoma State Fair participant, general and livestock rules.)**

1. Heifers born on or after September 1, 2019 and Bulls born on or after January 1, 2018 will be allowed to show in junior shows. Bulls one year or older must be shown with nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached.
2. The American Angus Association (hereinafter referred to as AAA) may contribute to premium support offered in individual classes for junior Angus heifers according to number of head shown in the previous year. The premium assistance shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the Oklahoma State Fair to the exhibitors.
3. A minimum of 15 head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer classes to be potentially eligible for the AAA to assist with premium support. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums.
4. Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.
5. To be eligible for AAA premium support, the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. Any contribution by the AAA for premium support will be included in the total premiums listed in each class and paid by the Oklahoma State Fair.
6. Premiums from the AAA are paid only to the recorded owner(s) of registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the AAA. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they are eligible for the Association's portion of the premiums. The AAA does not contribute to premiums for championship classes. The AAA will only count an animal one time toward the total count for possible premium support.
7. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted – only the original certificates issued by the American Angus Association. Any animal, upon check-in, that does not have a legible, permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
8. Any female shown with calf at side must be the cow's most recent, natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check-in.
9. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
10. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2 Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are included in Part 2: Association Rules; Section 8 series. These rules can be found at [www.angus.org](http://www.angus.org).
11. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp, or other similar substances externally, and steroids,





growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

12. At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member-owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to: a “white towel” or “white glove” test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated makeup areas.
13. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
14. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.
15. A limited number of tie outs will be available during the Oklahoma State Fair on a first-come, first-served basis for paid cattle entries.

Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The AAA does not contribute to premiums for championship classes. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are **NOT** accepted – only the original certificates issued by the American Angus Association. Any animal, upon check-in, that does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
3. Any female shown with calf at side must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check-in.
4. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Any animal found to be in violation would be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.
7. At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds towards the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to: a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in the designated make up areas.
8. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
9. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.



10. **Breeders six-head:** the exhibitor of the breeders six-head must be breeder and first owner, identified by the same member code for the animals exhibited. Cattle owned by other exhibitors may be included, provided the exhibitor of the breeders six-head is the breeder and first owner of the included animal(s). Animals must be exhibited in individual classes. Cattle bred and owned by a junior member(s) may be included if the exhibitor of the breeders six-head is an individual or married couple and is the parent or legal guardian of the junior member(s).
11. A limited number of tie outs will be available during the Oklahoma State Fair on a first-come, first-served basis for paid cattle entries.

#### **RULES (in addition to the Oklahoma State Fair participant, general and livestock rules.)**

1. Animals must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders' Association (ABBA) to be eligible to compete in association-sponsored shows. The registration certificates, for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or manager of the show at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
2. The registration number and animal identification number (number branded on animal) of each animal must be entered in an individual class, the sire of each get-of-sire and the dam of each produce-of-dam entry must be listed on the entry card of each animal entered.
3. Entries that have not complied with rule 1 and rule 2 will not be eligible to show, receive premium monies or earn points in the Association's register of renown.
4. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in individual classes.
5. Entries will be listed numerically according to age, oldest first, in catalogs and judging schedules. Include animal identification number (number brand) as a part of identification. When entering the arena for judging, the handlers will line up cattle numerically.
6. Judges will be allowed to comment on placings in selected classes when conditions permit.
7. Each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical or circulatory constriction including banding or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Injections of foreign substances for cosmetic purposes shall be prohibited. If to the satisfaction of the ABBA's staff, officers, executive committee, or board of directors any animal has had its natural conformation and structure altered; then said animal shall be ruled ineligible to compete until such time the executive committee and owner(s) have reviewed the case.
8. In cases where families, companies, corporations, etc., are operated as a unit under the same management, but also have cattle registered in the name of the individual partners, said cattle, even though bearing a different ownership brand, are eligible to be shown in competition under the firm name provided they have not been, and will not be, shown in the name of the individuals.
9. For females being shown in the three oldest classes (\*females calved September 2016 – August 2017), the exhibitor must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian to be presented to show officials at time of check-in or registration paper check. The show reserves the right to perform pregnancy determination by palpation for females in the above classes at any given ABBA approved show if an official protest has been filed. Females exhibited in the last class **MUST** have a calf at side. The only exemption from this rule will be cows that have already weaned a calf and a registration certificate of the calf **MUST** be presented to the judge.
10. **All bulls will be shown with a nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached.** For bulls being shown in the oldest class, the exhibitor must have a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian stating the bull has produced viable semen. The certificate must be available for inspection by the judge on request.
11. This deals with the produce of dam classes and the get-of-sire class:
  - a. Embryo produce of dam: Two (2) animals from the above classes produced by one (1) dam by embryo transfer, either or both sexes may be represented. No ownership required.

- b. Natural produce of dam: Two (2) natural born animals produced by one (1) dam from the above classes, either or both sexes may be represented. No ownership required.
- c. Get-of-Sire: Four (4) animals from at least two (2) dams by one sire from the above individual classes, both sexes represented. No ownership required.
- 12. No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one (1) produce or embryo-produce of dam per dam.
- 13. Cows that are exhibited with calves at side must be in a lactating stage. Calves must be shown and exhibited with their dams and said calves must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging. The ring steward will inform the judge which cows whose calves are ineligible to show by this rule.
- 14. Cattle will not be allowed to show if their switches have been balled or glitter applied to their skin.
- 15. *The intent of the ABBA in shows that exhibit a large number of cattle is to divide the cattle into separate red and grey divisions.*
  - a. If so, the following procedure will apply. All grey cattle and solid black cattle will show grey. Red, black, and white speckled or red and white speckled cattle will show red. Cattle with questionable color pigmentation may be entered in the color division the breeder selects, however, said cattle are subject to inspection by a three (3) member ABBA committee. If the color commit/tee disagrees with the breeder, the pedigree and color of said animal will then be used to aid in the final determination. In those cases where questionable colored cattle possess both red and grey breeding, then the color committee will make the final determination. The decision of the color committee is final.
  - b. Once animals have been classified, they will remain in that classification unless they were young at the time of classification and it is apparent that they have changed their color.
  - c. In the get-of-sire and produce-of-dam classes, breeders will not be allowed to show cattle of mixed color. They will be entered as to the color division they are assigned by the color committee.
  - d. At split shows where the color committee is not present, a staff member with two (2) ABBA directors will clarify questionable colored cattle for that particular show. The color committee will do the final classification.
- 18. The owner on record of any registered animal entered in an ABBA approved show and/or his/her agent, exhibitor, fitter, handler and/or representative releases ABBA and its representatives from any and all liability that the seller/owner might claim as a result of injury of any kind sustained before, during or after handling cattle for any ABBA board approved activity.
- 19. For shows to remain approved point shows by ABBA, they must maintain a 40 head average for the previous two (2) years.
- 20. The official ABBA rules and procedures governing showing and exhibiting of registered Brahman cattle supersede any rules printed in any show catalog.
- 21. In an attempt to ensure that all animals receive an equal evaluation at the national and international shows, classes with more than 30 entries, may at the discretion of the show management and/or ABBA officials be split by age as evenly as possible.
- 22. A limited number of tie outs will be available during the Oklahoma State Fair on a first-come, first-served basis for paid cattle entries.

**RULES (in addition to the Oklahoma State Fair participant, general and livestock rules.)**

**Eligibility**

1. The owner(s) of record on all animals entered in an International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) national or regional point show must be an active member(s) of the IBBA in good standing.
2. Animals must be registered Brangus, Red Brangus, UltraBlack or UltraRed with the International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) to be eligible to compete in an IBBA-sponsored show. Animals recorded in the IBBA appendix registry are ineligible to show.
3. UltraBlacks and UltraReds must show separately from Brangus and Red Brangus, with the exception of calves shown at the side of their dams in both the Female and Cow Calf show. The registration prefix of the dam determines the classification of the pair.
4. All calves exhibited at the side of the female must be registered with the IBBA and meet all rules required for show eligibility and inspections of exhibits (refer to Rule 9.a). The registration prefix of the dam determines the classification of the pair.
5. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in respective individual classes. Cows exhibited in the cow/calf classes are not eligible for the group classes. **\*Cows exhibited in the cow/calf classes are not eligible for the group classes.**

**Animal Identification**

6. The registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the Superintendent or show manager at the time entries are verified prior to judging. Digital images and herd book data sheets will not be accepted.
7. Once an animal's identification has been verified by visual inspection of a brand or ear tattoo, it's registration papers will be stamped with seal of the IBBA with the date of the inspection. In future shows, this registration certificate with the seal will need to be presented at check in for identification purposes only. If this registration certificate is presented with the seal of the IBBA, the additional inspection of a brand or ear tattoo is not required. If a new or unstamped certificate is presented, the animal's identification must be verified again before a stamped is received again. Any animal is subject to recheck by the IBBA Ethics Committee at any show at any time.
8. Any animal upon check in which does not have a legible tattoo or brand corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. An animal may be tattooed immediately at a show for reinspection.

**Parent Verification**

9. All animals are required to have completed parent, both sire and dam, verification on file at IBBA prior to the show check-in. If an animal does not have DNA parent verification completed at that time, they will be ineligible to show. DNA parent verification is defined as having submitted DNA samples per the

IBBA DNA testing process of the animals being entered, their sire and their dam, and then having the show animal's genotype match to that of both parents as determined by the IBBA. (a) If the calf at side is over 90 days of the age by the date of show check-in, it must have parent verification completed by show check-in. If it is under 90 days, parent verification of the calf is not required. (b) Cows in the cow/calf pair classes are exempt from the parent verification requirement if they are born prior to September 1, 2016.

10. IBBA reserves the right to collect DNA samples at any IBBA-sanctioned show. Collection will be conducted by random draw for retesting of parentage at the association's expense. At the six national IBBA-sanctioned shows, three random samples will be collected from Brangus and UltraBlack entries and three random samples will be collected from Red Brangus and UltraRed entries. An animal found to not match the stated pedigree must resolve the question before it is allowed to show again.

#### **Physical Inspection and Eligibility**

11. Prior to check-in, heads of exhibited animals must be clipped of all hair, including topknots and be free of scurs and/or slick spots. Animals not in compliance at check in will be required to comply before check in is complete, or they will not be allowed to show.
12. Any animal found to have scurs and/or slick spots; or evidence of incisions, surgical or otherwise, in the following areas: head, testicles, sheath, navel, or dewlap; including scars from caesarean sections, will be disqualified from showing. They shall be disqualified at the show where the violation is determined and all future IBBA sponsored and sanctioned shows. A veterinary statement of purpose or cause will not be accepted.
13. Animals with illegal white (defined as white in front of the navel) or any indication of brindling (a color pattern characterized by red streaks mingled with black), or red animals with any unacceptable coloring (according to the IBBA Red High Color Scale – available at [gobrangus.com](http://gobrangus.com) – and including Brown, Grey, Yellow, Light to White, White Legs or Black Muzzle) are ineligible for show at the show in which the color issue is found. The animals are eligible for inspection at future shows.
14. No animal may be shown that has been pumped with any amount of liquid at any time once the animal enters the grounds of a show. The official show veterinarian may administer liquids orally, if so needed, without disqualifying animal(s) from exhibition. (a) A protest of this violation must be submitted per the Violation Policy (b) Penalty: The fitter and ranch entity involved with an animal being artificially filled with be banned from the show ring for one year and the animal will be disqualified from exhibition at that particular show.
15. All entries may be classified for judging on an age basis and should be entered in class according to age. Teeth may be inspected by a veterinarian designated by the IBBA in order to determine whether dental development is within allowable limits for the class so entered. If the veterinarian determines that in his opinion dental development exceeds maximum allowable limits, the animal shall be disqualified from the show where the error is determined and all future shows.

#### **Fitting and Presentation**

16. Animals unethically fitted to alter the conformation or appearance of the animal, as determined by the appointed IBBA Ethics Committee or IBBA Staff, will be immediately disqualified at the show in which the violation occurred. This includes (a) No animal may be shown that has had any foreign objects, glued to, or otherwise attached in a manner so as to alter its conformation or change its appearance. (b) Paint or coloring agents of any kind are not to be used on any animal exhibited at IBBA sponsored shows.
17. All bulls must have a nose ring or nose restraint with the lead attached at all times, with the exception of being tied in the stalls and tie outs. This includes but is not limited to being in the show ring and during check in. Bulls 250 days and younger are exempt from this requirement.
18. Unruly animals that cannot be kept under control will be disqualified at the said show. If an animal breaks away from its handlers three times, they will be dismissed from the show ring and not eligible to show at that particular show.

#### **Fertility and Performance Requirements**

19. Weights and scrotal measurements will be taken on all bulls at check-in at all six of the IBBA National Shows.
20. All Brangus bulls 18 months of age or older that are exhibited at IBBA sponsored shows must have passed a fertility examination given by a non-owner licensed veterinarian or a non-owner certified technician to the standards of the Society of Theriology to be eligible to show. The results of the examination must be available at check-in. Once a bull has a positive examination, retesting is not required.

21. All females 20 months of age or older exhibited at IBBA sanctioned shows, must have available at the time of check-in, a certificate of pregnancy issued by an accredited non-owner veterinarian, non-owner certified professional or blood test results certificate. If a blood tests results certificate is provided, it must be blood collected by a non-owner veterinarian or non-owner certified professional and documented. If the female is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, a certified copy of the flush record showing viable embryos produced by the said female must be presented at check-in, by a non-owner embryologist. If verification cannot be produced, the female will be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site and verify pregnancy. Females showing in the Senior Heifer Division of Springs Shows (January 1 through May 31) must adhere to the classifications and have an IBBA registered natural calf, not older than 250 days of age on show date.
22. The IBBA and its representative have the authority to request and require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification, pedigree of exhibited animals and enforce all show rules as adopted by the IBBA. IBBA representatives shall include the appointed Ethics Committee at each show. A decision by the Ethics Committee and/or the IBBA representative shall stand at the show in which it is made.

**Show Rules Violation Policy and Penalties**

23. Owners are responsible for any infraction committed by a non-member or anyone employed or contracted by the owner.
24. A valid show rules violation complaint must be accompanied by a written statement describing the violation, the perpetrator of the violation, and signed by an active member of the IBBA. This written complaint will be presented to an Ethics Committee consisting of the Chairman of the Show Committee and the three person Ethics Committee that has been previously appointed for the show where the complaint is presented. All four people will be current members of the Show Committee.
25. The Ethics Committee shall rule on the validity of the rule violation. The Ethics Committee shall visit with the perpetrator, present the written complaint, and make a ruling on the complaint if valid. The penalty will be applied according to each stated rule above.
26. The perpetrator is entitled to appeal any decision made by an IBBA representative, Ethics Committee, a veterinarian, certified industry professional or designated association representatives to the IBBA Board of Directors. The following requirements must be met: 1) the appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party; and 2) the appealing party files the written appeal with the IBBA Board of Directors as soon as possible after the decision is rendered however, the ruling will stand at the show in which the violation occurred. If the IBBA Board of Directors overturns the ruling of the Show Committee Ethics Committee, the exhibitor and or animal in question will be allowed to return to future shows. The IBBA Board of Directors has the right to disqualify the perpetrator from the IBBA approved show after hearing an appeal. The IBBA’s Board of Directors decision is final.
27. Entries that have not complied with all of the above rules will not be eligible to show, to receive premium monies, or earn points in the IBBA’s Show Sire of the Year, Show Dam of the Year, Show Bull of the Year, Show Heifer of the Year and Show Cow Calf Pair awards.
28. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any function each exhibitor hereby releases the Association, its officers, directors, and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits, and judgments past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision there from.
29. **Produce of Dam:** Two animals out of the same dam; can be both sexes by different bulls.
30. **Junior Get of Sire:** Three head, both sexes by one sire; must be senior calves and younger.
31. **Senior Get of Sire:** Four head, both sexes by one sire; can be any age in current classifications.
32. **Breeders Herd:** Four head; both sexes do not have to be represented; must be bred and owned or bred and co-owned by exhibitor.
33. A limited number of tie outs will be available during the Oklahoma State Fair on a first-come, first-served basis for paid cattle entries.

Cattle will also be made available for a veterinary examination and be mouthed for the purpose of age verification. Those cattle found to be questionable in the opinion of the veterinarian, may be removed from the show or moved to a different class at the discretion of the show committee.

3. All exhibitors are subject to the rules and regulations of the Oklahoma State Fair and the American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA). Any person found guilty of misrepresentation or not abiding by the show rules will be disqualified from showing.
4. All animals must be registered in the AMAA and the original certificate must be inspected before the show.
5. All animals must be 25% to 58% Maine-Anjou or greater.
6. Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and correspond with the registration certificate.
7. The surgical or non-surgical alteration or conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
8. The use of false tail heads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
9. The dyeing or artificial changing of the overall natural color of any animal is prohibited. Coloring agents may be used on the legs and tail switches, but none may be used above the flank.
10. All animals must be dehorned.
11. All cattle shall be made available for veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering. Cattle will also be made available for a veterinary examination and be mouthed for the purpose of age verification. Those cattle found to be questionable in the opinion of the veterinarian, may be removed from the show or moved to a different class at the discretion of the show committee.
12. Exhibitors of heifers 20 months of age or older must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian available for inspection. A copy of the registration papers showing all ownership of animal must accompany an entry of each animal.
13. Bulls exhibited at 20 months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
14. Bulls six months of age or older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
15. At the discretion of the superintendent, classes may be split if entries warrant.
16. A limited number of tie outs will be available during the Oklahoma State Fair on a first-come, first-served basis for paid cattle entries.

1. **Pre-Juniors can participate in the Junior show.** Participants under the age of 8 may show if they have reached their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday by September 24, 2021.
2. Participants must NOT have reached their 22<sup>nd</sup> birthday by September 24, 2021.
3. Pre-Junior Show Exhibitors (3–7-year-old) may have one person to assist with exhibiting their animal. An assistant may be a parent, sibling, or another junior exhibitor: *8 years of age or older*. The exhibitors are to handle the showing. One show stick per animal allowed and the use of the show stick is only to be done by the actual exhibitor. Adult (or assistant) role is for safety reasons only and said assistant is not allowed to assist with setting up or exhibition of the animal. (i.e., the assistant cannot take control of the show stick/halter to set up the animal). The pre-junior exhibitor must be attentive to their animal at all times. *Excessive coaching, assisting or verbal communication between assistant and exhibitor is not allowed and may be penalized.*
4. *Any pre-junior (ages 3-7 years old) showing a bull **MUST** have an adult assistant accompany them in the show ring and follow guidelines noted above.*
5. Bulls born on or after September 1, 2018 will be allowed to show in this junior show. Bulls one year and older must be shown with nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached.
6. All animals must have legible tattoos that correspond exactly to their registration papers.
7. Registration papers must show that the animal was owned or transferred to the exhibitor prior to July 1 of the current year. All exhibitors must have registration papers in their name.
8. Registration papers from the breed association that are in order are acceptable. Copies, telegrams, or phone calls are not acceptable. These will be required upon check-in.

1. Heifers born on or after September 1, 2019 and Bulls born on or after January 1, 2020 will be allowed to show in junior shows. Bulls one year or older must be shown with nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached.
2. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered meeting the requirements for registration as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis rules and regulations for registration and shall be governed by the last revised version of the **rules and regulations for approved Santa Gertrudis open and junior shows** as approved by SGBI, P.O. Box 1257, Kingsville, TX 78364. A copy may be obtained by contacting the association or viewed at [www.santagertrudis.com](http://www.santagertrudis.com).
3. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted – only the original certificates.
4. Heifers may be entered in the open show by submitting entry forms and paying the applicable entry fees (see Division 1026).
5. The heifer must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor prior to July 1 of the current year.
6. Any animal with a pending or applied for registration or without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for show competition.
7. All entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the SGBI.

#### **RULES (in addition to the Oklahoma State Fair participant, general and livestock rules.)**

1. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered meeting the requirements for registration as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis rules and regulations for registration and shall be governed by the last revised version of the **rules and regulations for approved Santa Gertrudis open and junior shows** as approved by SGBI, P.O. Box 1257, Kingsville, TX 78364. A copy may be obtained by contacting the association or viewed at [www.santagertrudis.com](http://www.santagertrudis.com).
2. Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. This means the active or junior member has paid all current dues and fees with no outstanding balances on their accounts.
3. **ALL** animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspection at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the shows and exhibits committee and one (1) from the breed standards committee.
4. Heifers, 24 months of age or older, must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, this must be verified in a written statement and signed by a licensed embryo technician.
5. A cow shown with calf at side: calf must be her natural calf meeting the standard of excellence and must be registered if older than 30 days. If calf is less than 30 days of age it is subject to registration.
6. All senior bull classes, late junior yearling bull and over, must have either a nose ring or a nose clip for show purposes.
7. All animals must be individually identified by tattoo and/or a numerical fire or freeze brand.
8. All animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. **\*Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show.** Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick; head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clip using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped (no steer or Brahman clips) and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tailhead clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.); trim tail (no shear except back side). Fitting handbook should be studied.
9. Each animal must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
10. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
11. Polled classes will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge.
12. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals must be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue.

13. There must be at least five (5) exhibitors and 25 head of cattle or a minimum of 50 head of cattle, to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis show.
14. In all shows where 50 head or less are entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of the show officials.
15. Classes with more than 30 entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
16. The judge must be an SGBI approved judge.
17. Dress for showing in an approved SGBI show shall be: clean and neat clothing of collared shirts with sleeves, belts, no midribs showing and appropriate footwear – no tennis shoes. Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded - no caps.
18. Juniors showing in open shows is allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents, legal guardian). No animal may be fitted or shown by any open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. An exception is transportation feed and care to a show may be allowed. Refer to junior ownership rules.
19. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure **without** alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, pharmaceutical, or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming, or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid, diuretic or any other substance is allowed. **ALL** animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.
20. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.
21. Every exhibitor, in consideration of their entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by them to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the shows and exhibits committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference, or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the shows and exhibits committee according to the equities of the case.
22. Any person who furnished the birthday of the animal to SGBI either on the International Purebred Registration Application of some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in an SGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than 30 days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certification shall be barred from showing in a SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one (1) year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However, the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be shown again.
23. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, and all claims, suits, and judgments, either past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision therefrom.
24. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association.
25. Appeals: An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or designated association representation designated by the SGBI under sections 1 and 4 of the inspection of exhibits may be made to the executive committee of SCBI if the following requirements are satisfied:
  - a. The appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party; and
  - b. The appealing party files the written appeal with SGBI board of directors of SGBI representative or fair officials as soon as possible after the veterinarian's decision is rendered and in any event within six (6) hours of the time of the veterinarian's or designated association representatives' decision was made. If an appeal satisfying the foregoing requirements is filed with the SGBI board of directors, the board of directors shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party and the veterinarian or designated association representatives whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that is relevant to the matter, following which the board of directors shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.





- 26. Procedures to file a protest:
  - a. File protest with shop that infraction occurred. Follow their protest rules.
  - b. File the same protest with the shows and exhibits committee. Contact the chairman.
  - c. Three (3) exhibitors must sign the protest.
  - d. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the shows and exhibits committee within 24 hours after the occasion for such protests.
  - e. Order of hearing a protest:
    - 1. Chairman of shows and exhibits committee
    - 2. Action by shows and exhibits committee
    - 3. Final action by board of directors
    - 4. Follow appeal procedure as outlined in the rules and regulations
  - f. All rules and regulations that have been properly protested to the shows and exhibits committee shall be subject to the following penalties:
    - 1. Loss of premium money
    - 2. Loss of awards
    - 3. Suspension from showing that animal as deemed necessary. Penalty may be for one to three shows, or as long as deemed necessary for the offense.
    - 4. Suspension of the exhibitor being the same as other SGBI rules penalties.
- 28. Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.
- 29. Disqualifications: An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting, or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge over-looked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by representative, interferes with the judge(s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude them from further competition; exhibitor premiums, that may have been awarded been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him may be moved up (at the option of the shows and exhibits committee) to fill the vacated position.
- 30. Rules for high point awards:
  - a. For each point show: First place - 2 points; second place - 1 point; Division Champion - 3 points; Reserve Division Champion - 2 points; Grand Champion - 5 points; and Reserve Grand Champion - 4 points. Best of Polled receives 1 point but does not count toward overall points.
  - b. Get of Sire and produce of dam points go toward Exhibitor/Breeder of the Year Awards.
  - c. Points will stay with animal if sold.
  - d. The Sire and Dam of the Year should have points from at least two (2) different offspring.
  - e. All points earned at the national open show are to be doubled.
- 31. Conduct in the Show Ring: If any exhibitor/owner/showman interferes in any way with the judge or shows disrespect to him, or to the show in the ring, the judge or show management may dismiss the exhibitor/owner/showman from the ring. Management may withhold from each exhibitor/owner/showman any premium monies that may have been awarded or take other steps deemed desirable.
- 32. DNA test on questionable animals: SGBI and its representatives reserve the right to require any test deemed necessary to verify the accuracy of an entry, classification and/or the pedigree of exhibited Santa Gertrudis animals, including calves exhibited at the side of a Santa Gertrudis female.
- 33. A limited number of tie outs will be available during the Oklahoma State Fair on a first-come, first-served basis for paid cattle entries.

2. American Shorthorn Association staff will accept electronic registration papers at ASA sanctioned shows for check-in, unless otherwise stated by the hosting shows rules.
3. **Cow/Calf is a division** that will be included with all other female divisions (eight divisions) for selection of Grand Champion Female and Reserve Grand Champion Female.
4. All Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the ASA. All Purebred and ShorthornPlus are subject to parentage DNA testing by ASA. 1. A Skillathon is an event held to test an individual's knowledge of specific subject matter using the experiential learning model of exploring, reflecting, and applying that knowledge. Using materials directly or modified from the Learning Laboratory Kits, as well as activities developed from information provided in and adapted from the Ohio 4-H Animal Resource Handbooks, Oklahoma State University Extension Fact Sheets and various other sources. Skillathons are created to challenge the exhibitor's knowledge of all aspects of each respective animal species. Each Skillathon is comprised of four (4) educational and challenging activities stations. Youth move from station to station, attempting to perform the tasks they are given. A facilitator is present to offer directions only if needed. Station scores are recorded on the exhibitor's score sheet by facilitator and entered into a computer program that calculates each youth's placing.
2. Topics to be expected: quality assurance, animal anatomy, nutrition, meat cut identification, reproduction and genetics, diseases, and animal care.

### RULES (in addition to the Oklahoma State Fair participant, general and livestock rules.)

1. All Skillathons are open to any Oklahoma 4-H member, age 8 and in the third grade to age 18 as of July 1, 2021, and FFA members. Therefore, 4-H and FFA members turning 19 on or before September 17, 2021 are too old to participate in the Skillathons. Youth do not have to be an exhibitor at the Oklahoma State Fair to participate.
2. There are two (2) age divisions: **Juniors** - age 8-12, and **Seniors**, age 13-18. If it is determined at the completion of the Skillathon that an exhibitor was entered in the wrong age division, the exhibitor will be disqualified from the competition and not eligible for placings or awards. Parents: Verify with your county extension professional your child's correct 4-H age, as this is the basis for age classification.
3. Once you register for the Skillathon, you must wait for your turn and expect to go through the line when called. Once you enter the Skillathon, you **CANNOT** leave. If you leave, you forfeit any further participation in that respective species Skillathon.
4. Skillathon participants are not permitted to bring study materials or electronic devices, such as cell phones, into the Skillathon evaluation area.
5. Participants will be required to sign the back of their score sheet upon completion.
6. Ties for Skillathon awards and age class placings will be broken by the following procedure:
  - a. First – Skillathon Station no. 2 score
  - b. Second – Skillathon Station no. 3 score
  - c. Third – Skillathon Station no. 4 score
  - d. An additional fifth "Tiebreaker Station" may be administered.
7. The four (4) subject matter station categories for each species will be posted on the respective species bulletin board closest to the show arena.
8. Exhibitor agrees to abide by all rules, regulations, specifications, and requirements set out in the rules and regulations found on page 2 and any other rules distributed by OSF management.
9. Participants not pre-entered in other livestock competitions and parents/guests will be required to purchase admission into the Oklahoma State Fair.

#### **AOB and Genetic Recovery**

- AOB - Any animal that represents a Dairy breed division not offered by the Oklahoma State Fair.
- Genetic Recovery - Any registered animal that is permanently identified but does not meet national show requirements for recognized breeds. All animals must have papers stating their breed percentages. This division is only open to papered animals not eligible to exhibit in the divisions below.

#### **Ayrshire**

- All animals exhibiting in the Holstein show must be recorded by Holstein Association USA as 87% RHA (Registered Holstein Ancestry) or above.

#### **Jersey**

- All animals exhibiting in the Jersey show must have a certificate of registration issued by the American Jersey Cattle Association with a generation count of four {4} or higher.

#### **Milking Shorthorn**

- All animals exhibiting in the Milking Shorthorn show must have a minimum herdbook status of the EXP suffix, as designated by the American Milking Shorthorn Society. No females with a status requiring any prefix designation are eligible to show as Milking Shorthorn.

**Theron Jones Memorial Overall Senior Champion Award:**

Is presented in recognition and remembrance of Theron Jones to the 4-H or FFA member whose show animal is selected as the Overall Champion Female. Theron Jones exhibited at the Oklahoma State Fair every year from 1936 with a barrow, to 2000 with his Jerseys. Theron bought his first Jerseys in 1943 and exhibited them locally and nationally through 2000. He began teaching agriculture education at Vanoss, Oklahoma in 1945, moved to Tuttle in 1948 and remained there until retirement, to continue teaching on his farm and conducting tours for thousands of Oklahoma City children. These tours earned him a feature article in Orbit magazine. Jones was a friend to many and grandpa to the hundreds of children he helped through the years. In addition to teaching, Jones was also dedicated to service, holding the office of president, at one time or another, in the following organizations: Grady County Fair Board, Tuttle Lions Club, Oklahoma Purebred Dairy Cattle Association, Oklahoma Jersey Cattle Association and Sooner State Dairy Show. He also served as an Oklahoma State Fair Dairy Superintendent for 30-plus years, an elder in the Tuttle Church of Christ and on the executive board of the Oklahoma DHIA. The Overall Champion Junior Show Award, sponsored by the friends of Theron Jones, is given annually. The winner will receive a plaque to keep in recognition of this outstanding achievement. Premium: \$100

**Ernest R. Berousek Memorial Reserve Overall Senior Champion Award:**

Is presented in recognition and remembrance of Ernest Berousek, PhD to the 4-H or FFA member whose show animal is selected as Reserve Overall Champion Female. Ernest Berousek was a lifelong Guernsey enthusiast, supporter of the Oklahoma dairy industry and youth activities. He purchased his first dairy heifer in 1934, from the E.K. Gaylord Farm. The next year he purchased two more heifers and with his brother Otto, this was the beginning of building the nationally known, Lily Lane Guernsey Herd. Ernie continued his education, graduating from Oklahoma A and M, while working at the college dairy earning money for his college education. He went on and earned his master's degree from the University of MO and a PhD in Dairy Breeding. During his lifetime, he was awarded "The Pioneer Award" from the National Dairy Shire and "The Master Breeder Award" from the American Guernsey Association. ### GENERAL INFORMATION

- A Skillathon is an event held to test an individual's knowledge of specific subject matter using the experiential learning model of exploring, reflecting, and applying that knowledge.
- Using materials directly or modified from the Learning Laboratory Kits, as well as activities developed from information provided in and adapted from the Ohio 4-H Animal Resource Handbooks, Oklahoma State University Extension Fact Sheets, and various other sources.
- Skillathons are created to challenge the exhibitor's knowledge of all aspects of each respective animal species. Each Skillathon is comprised of four educational and challenging activities stations. Youth move from station to station, attempting to perform the tasks they are given. A facilitator is present at each station to offer directions if needed, without helping the exhibitor perform the station tasks, and without offering answers. Station scores are recorded on the exhibitor's score sheet by each facilitator and entered into a computer program that calculates each youth's placing. Winners are announced at the individual species awards ceremonies.
- Topics to be expected: quality assurance, animal anatomy, nutrition, meat cut identification, reproduction and genetics, diseases, and animal care.

### RULES

1. All Skillathons are open to any FFA member and Oklahoma 4-H member, age 8 and in the 3rd grade, to age 18 as of July 1, 2021. Therefore, 4-H and FFA members turning 19 on or before September 17, 2021 are too old to participate in the Skillathon. Youth do not have to be an exhibitor at the Oklahoma State Fair to participate.
2. There are two (2) age divisions: juniors, ages 8 - 12 and seniors, ages 13 - 18. If it is determined at the completion of the Skillathon an exhibitor was entered in the wrong age division, the exhibitor will be disqualified from the competition and not eligible for placing or awards. Parents: verify with your county extension professional your child's correct 4-H age, as this is the basis for age classification.
3. Once you register for the Skillathon, you must wait for your turn and go through the line when called. Once you enter the Skillathon, you **CANNOT** leave. If you leave, you forfeit any further participation in that respective species Skillathon.
4. Skillathon participants are not permitted to bring study materials or electronic devices, such as cell phones, into the evaluation area.
5. Participants will be required to sign the back of their score sheet upon completion.
6. Ties for Skillathon awards and age class placings will be broken by the following procedure:
  - First: Skillathon Station no. 2 score
  - Second: Skillathon Station no. 3 score
  - Third: Skillathon Station no. 4 Score
  - An additional fifth "Tiebreaker Station" may be administered.
7. The four (4) subject matter station categories for each species will be posted on the respective species bulletin board in proximity to the show arena.
8. Participants not pre-entered in other livestock competitions, and parents/guests, will be required to purchase admission into the Oklahoma State Fair.

1. All rules governing the livestock department, as well as the general rules and regulations governing OSF, will apply in this show.
2. In addition to submitting entry forms to OSF, a copy of your entry forms and International Llama Registry (ILR) registration papers must also be mailed to Christina Abel, 719 W 8<sup>th</sup> Street, Liberal KS 67901. There will be no check-in without papers, no exceptions.
3. Individual Llama and Alpaca ILR/AOA/ARI or CLRC registration numbers and ALSA membership numbers must be noted on entry form.
4. IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING MEMBERSHIP AND SHOW POINTS: Membership is required to be eligible for show points in ALSA and/or ILR. OSF will not be responsible for verifying your need for membership.
5. It is necessary to pay ALSA/ILR per animal fees FOR ALL ANIMALS with entries.
6. Youth events:
  - All youth between the ages of 7 and 18 as of January 1, 2021, may show in ALSA approved Youth classes.
  - The 4 to 6-year-old division does not receive ALSA points.
  - To qualify for youth ALSA points, the youth must be an ALSA member. Points go to the exhibitor, not the animals.
  - All youth aged 7 and above must be members of ALSA or pay non-member fee of \$15.
  - For information about ALSA membership, contact the llama show superintendent or ALSA.
  - Youth aged 7 - 18 years of age may show intact males; however, Youth aged 7 - 12 years of age may not show intact males that are over 24 months of age.
  - An individual Llama or Alpaca can be entered in either Youth or Open Performance Classes (Novice or Advanced) but not both.
  - Youth must have written permission from a parent, project leader, 4-H advisor or FFA advisor to participate in the youth events.
  - Any Llama or Alpaca shown by a youth handler in “no entry fee” class (halter or costume) must also be duly entered in at least one additional halter or performance class requiring payment of an entry fee.
7. All llamas and alpacas must have ILR or CLRC registrations; all alpacas AOA, ARI or CLRC registrations. (Exceptions: Youth or Gelding classes.)
8. All Llamas and Alpacas, (in-state and out-of-state), must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of the arrival at the OSF. No blood tests required. Health papers will be checked upon arrival at OKCF.
9. The date for determining the animal’s age is September 25, 2021.
10. Handler’s attire should be conservative, neat, and appropriate for the class. Shoes must be worn and be appropriate. (Open toe shoes, sandals, and bare feet will disqualify the exhibitor.)
11. Classes with less than 3 animals may be combined at discretion of OSF Show Management.
12. Classes numbered 01, 02, 03, 06, 07, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 18, 19, 22, 23, 26, 27, 30, 31, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, and 44 will be open to Llamas and/or Alpacas. Will be designated (\*) on following class list.



13. Llama Wool Division:

- Light / Medium Wool: Minimal to long body wool, short to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool
- Heavy Wool: Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool (Leg wool at least to knee and hock)
- Suri: The fleece of a Suri Llama should drape over the llama’s body forming a natural part along the spine.
- The fibers should be grouped into a well-defined lock structure, which is indicated by the many individual separate locks of fiber formed at the skin and carrying out to the ends of the individual locks, which should be independent and consistent in size and degree of spiral throughout the neck and body.

## **SWINE HEALTH DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS:**

1. All swine must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, (CVI), processed and issued within **30** days of the date of arrival at OKCF, that shows official individual identification by an **840 electronic tag**, complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed, and that they are free of external parasites, ringworms, or warts, or any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. **All swine must have a premises ID listed on the CVI.**
2. **In-state swine** must have a negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies after June 1, 2021 or be from a Validated Brucellosis/Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd and be exhibited by the owners and/or immediate family members. The last quarterly test date (July test) must be listed on the CVI.
  - **Breeding gilts** should be quarantined and retested 30 days after the show before being commingled with other breeding swine.
  - **Out-of-state swine** must have a CVI, an entry permit, proof of negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies within 30 days of entry to the fair or be from a Validated/Qualified Herd with verification of the last quarterly test within 3 months and be identified with an individual official USDA Ear Tag.

## **SWINE BREED CHARACTERISTICS GUIDELINES:**

### Berkshire

- A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire characteristics.
- A Berkshire must have white on all four (4) legs, face, and tail, unless the tail is docked. One (1) of the white leg points may also be missing.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or solid black face from the ears forward.
- A Berkshire must NOT have a solid black nose - rim of nose.
- White is allowed on the ears, but NO solid white may appear.
- An occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

### Chester White

- Must possess Chester White breed characteristics.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
- Any skin pigmentation, other than white, that exceeds five (5) in number is disqualified.
- Ears must be down and medium size.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

### Duroc

- Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed characteristics.
- Ears must be down and medium size.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any white or black hair on the animal.
- Must NOT have more than three (3) black spots on the skin, none of which can be larger than 2 inches in diameter.
- Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

### Hampshire

- Must possess Hampshire breed characteristics.
- Ears must be erect and not rounded.
- Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may be partially or totally encircling the body.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
- Must not have any red hair.

### Hereford

- Must be red, light, or dark however, with a white head, ears, and 4 white legs.
- Ears must be at least broke forward.
- Hereford Market Animals. Shall be eligible with at least 50% of a white face, at least 50% red body, at least 2 white feet. This will be known as the \*50-50-50 rule”.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Reporting of belts and black spots in breeding animals off springs. Belts and black spots do appear occasionally. It is the job of the breeders and members to do their best to eliminate this from their herds.

### Landrace (Gilts only eligible to show in 2021)

- Must be white in color and possess Landrace breed characteristics (ears must be down).
- Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
- Must NOT allow any color hair other than white.
- Must NOT allow more than three (3) spots of skin pigmentation.
- Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter.
- Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.

### Poland China

- Must possess Poland China breed characteristics.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must be black with six (6) white points - face, feet, and tail - with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one (1) black leg and to be determined as a Poland China. Tail docking is permissible, eliminating that white point.
- Must have ears down.
- Must NOT have evidence of belt formation.
- Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
- Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of such tampering are ineligible.
- Must NOT have any colored hair, other than white or black.
- Must NOT have any red or blue colored skin pigmentation larger than a silver dollar.
- Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

### Spot

- Must possess Spot breed characteristics.
- Must be black and white in color.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Ears must be down and reasonably sized.
- Any red tinted or sandy brown spots are ineligible.
- No solid black head from ears forward.
- No distinct white belt pattern - hair or skin - encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

### Yorkshire

- Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed characteristics.
- Ears must be erect.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any colored hair, other than white.
- Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than a silver dollar.
- Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

Dr. James D. White, a native of Lindsay, Oklahoma, devoted more than 30 years of his life to youth education, in both public schools and higher education. After five years as a high school agriculture education instructor in Davenport, he returned to Oklahoma State University (OSU) to attend graduate school. After completion of graduate school, he accepted a position as a faculty member in the agriculture education department at OSU. White received many honors through the years including: an Honorary American Farmer Degree, OVATA Gold-Teacher of Teachers Award and the Outstanding Academic Advisor in the OSU College of Agriculture. He was a great supporter of youth livestock activities and the Oklahoma State Fair for his entire career. This included many behind the scenes

activities, for which he never received or expected recognition, and helping with the OSF Golden Pork Chop Contest, Junior Barrow Show and Junior Lamb Show. He recruited OSU College of Agriculture students for State Fair interns and student helpers at the livestock shows. He was also a FFA Meats Judging Contest superintendent at the Spring Oklahoma Youth Livestock Show for many years. White was recognized nationally for his enthusiasm, zeal, and dedication to teaching youth. His work ethics and honesty are beyond reproach, and an inspiration to us all.

- **Poland China Record Association Special Award**

The Poland China Record Association (PCRA), P.O. 9758, Peoria IL 61612-9758, will present a trophy to the Grand Champion Barrow exhibitor over all breeds, providing it is out of a recorded Poland China sire and dam. A picture of the winning animal, barrow certificate and certification by OSF must be sent to the PCRA within 30 days of the show. The PCRA will award \$15 worth of future recording credit to the exhibitor of the Champion Poland China Barrow for each 20 head, with a minimum of 20, of Poland Chinas exhibited upon receipt of the winner’s registration number, number of Poland Chinas exhibited, and name and address of exhibitor from show officials.
