
June 1	New competition guides posted online.
July 1	Online registration opens at 9 a.m.
August 15	Entry deadline for the Oklahoma State Fair Creative Arts competitions and contests. Free registrations must be received online by August 15.
August 16	We will no longer accept late online registrations, but you will be able to register on site during take-in with a small fee of \$12. <u>All entries</u> will be turned in on the listed check-in days/the day of the live contest.
August 26	Entry clerks will receive canning items at the Creative Arts Building from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee done electronically.
August 27	Entry clerks will receive canning items at the Creative Arts Building from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee done electronically.
August 28	All canned items will be judged. This is closed judging. Exhibitors are not permitted to attend. We encourage you to come to the Fair to view results. Judging results will be posted online as soon as they are available, possibly after the end of the State Fair. Do not call or email to ask for results. They cannot be given out prior to posting.
September 9	Entry clerks will receive all other non-canned cooking items at the Creative Arts Building from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee done electronically.
September 10	Entry clerks will receive all other non-canned cooking items at the Creative Arts Building from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee done electronically.
September 14	Oklahoma State Fair opens! The Creative Arts Building will host a series of demonstrations, live contests, and special events every day of the Fair.
September 24	Last day of the Oklahoma State Fair.
September 25	Entry clerks will release exhibits upon presentation of claim check at the Creative Arts Building from 2 to 7 p.m.
September 26	Entry clerks will release exhibits upon presentation of claim check at the Creative Arts Building from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Items not picked up become property of the Oklahoma State Fair.

How To Get Here: Pre-Fair

Our physical address is 3100 General Pershing Blvd, OKC, OK 73107.

From I-44 take the NW 10th St. eastbound exit and follow until NW 10th St. and May Ave. (2nd light). Turn right onto May Ave. Proceed to Gate 3 (1st light) and drive towards the gate. You will then enter the OKC Fairgrounds and make your way to the Creative Arts Building.

Drop-Off Information

For **Canning**: Drop-off is Saturday, August 26 from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. and Sunday, August 27 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. At check-in you will be given a claim check tag. PLEASE SAVE THESE as they are what you will need to pick up your item(s). Canning will only be accepted these days.

For all other **Pre-Fair Contests**: Drop-off is Saturday, September 9 from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. and Sunday, September 10 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. At check-in you will be given a claim check tag. PLEASE SAVE THESE as they are what you will need to pick up your item(s). Canning **WILL NOT** be accepted this weekend.

Pick Up Information

Pick up is Monday, September 25 from 2 - 7 p.m. and Tuesday, September 26 from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. Please remember to bring your claim check tag as this is how you reclaim your pieces.

CREATIVE ARTS RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRY INFORMATION

Who Can Enter? ONLY OKLAHOMA RESIDENTS may enter our contests. Exhibitors entering must be amateurs unless an Open (expert) Division is offered.

Who is considered an Amateur? Someone who earns less than 10% of their income from this skill. If you have taught this craft before, or currently teach, you are not considered an Amateur, but may enter in an open class, if available.

Are there any size limitations? Furniture may be no larger than 40" in any direction. All other exhibits are limited to 30" in any direction.

How many exhibits can be entered? ONE ENTRY PER CLASS (unless otherwise stated.) There is no limit on the total number of entries. Photography is the exception with 12 total entries allowed per exhibitor. All entries must have been completed since the final day of the previous Oklahoma State Fair.

What is the cost to enter? CREATIVE ARTS ENTRIES ARE FREE if registered by August 15. (Only the wine contest requires an entry fee.)

May I mail in my exhibit? No.

Do I need to pre-register for live contests? Yes. You cannot register the day of.

How do I get into the Fair if I am entered in a live contest? ONLY EXHIBITORS receive FREE ENTRY AND PARKING with live contests. Family and friends will need to purchase a ticket to get in the day of the contest. Please check out our pre-sale of tickets starting in July and ending the day before the start of the Fair.

All entries must be the work of the exhibitor and completed since the previous Oklahoma State Fair except as noted.

CREATIVE ARTS DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS

- The Oklahoma State Fair reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered if it is objectionable in any way, if it requires an excessive amount of space, or if the capacity of the department has been reached. Any contest may be cancelled for lack of entries.
- Each item turned in is completed by one person, unless otherwise noted in the competition information.
- Your items will be handled with care, however, Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. is not responsible for items that are damaged while on display during the Fair. Exhibitors MAY NOT supply their own display stands. Only OSF stands will be used for display.
- Each exhibit will be evaluated by qualified individuals and the decision of the judge(s) is final. All cash prizes will be paid from the awards as
 marked by the judges and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. Judges are instructed not to award cash prizes unless the
 exhibit is deemed worthy of the placing awarded. Premium payouts for the Creative Arts Department will be mailed to exhibitors after the
 close of the Fair.
- Within 90 days from the last day of the 2023 Oklahoma State Fair, it is the responsibility of the Payee to file, in writing, a claim for lost or incorrect awards.
- If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made any false statement with regards to any article or exhibit, or if any exhibitor attempts to harass
 or interfere with the judge or judges in the performance of their duties, the exhibitor shall be excluded from competition and forfeit all
 premiums.
- Any protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Said protest
 must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be filed with the Creative Programs Manager by 5 p.m. on Thursday of the
 closing week of the Fair. Judges will be encouraged to view exhibits after items have been placed on display with names. If they believe that
 an exhibitor is not in the correct skill level, that judge will be encouraged to protest the placement.
- Every effort will be made to display entries in an attractive arrangement; however, items entered for competition will be displayed through 3rd place. Other entries will be displayed only as space is available and at the discretion of the superintendents.

COOKING DEPARTMENT RULES & GUIDELINES

- Canned items turned in is Saturday, August 26 & Sunday, August 27. Canning items will only be accepted then. All
 other non-live cooking items will be turned in Saturday, September 9 & Sunday, September 10. All items not to be
 displayed during the Fair will be available for pick up
- DO NOT MAIL YOUR PRINTED RECIPES. Recipes must accompany each exhibit when it is entered. Please use the OSF Standard Recipe Template, if possible. The template is on the last page of this guide. It is also a fillable form on the webpage. If you choose to type the recipe on your own paper, please BE SURE the format is the same and it is on plain white paper with no frills or decoration on the page.
- For food safety, all ingredients, equipment and garnishes must be transported in clear plastic containers and/or storage tubs. All entries must be brought to the Fair on disposable plates, pans and boards. No baskets, cardboard boxes or any other type of opaque container will be permitted for ingredients, equipment or garnishes. No exceptions. Prepared dishes such as casseroles and pies may be brought in the container in which they were cooked. Thermal carries for hot dishes and ice chests for cold items are permissible. Glass dishes/pans may be used in live contests except where noted otherwise. Entries will not be accepted if displayed in baskets.
- Articles will be juried to the satisfaction of the judge. Live contest entries will not be released until the contest is over.
- Cooking items placing lower than 3rd and canning items placing lower than 5th may be picked up the Tuesday before the Fair between 2 - 5 p.m. Results will not be known by the Creative Programs Manager at this time to give information over the phone. Perishable food items and containers will be disposed of after this window while canning items will be stored until after the Fair for pick up.

NOTE: ALL BAKED GOODS BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR AND WILL BE REMOVED WHEN SPOILED. RECIPES BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR AND THEIR SPONSORS, INCLUDING PUBLICATION RIGHTS.

DEDEPERTY CHOICE RULESOnly cash accepted.
Tasting kits are sold 30 minutes before the start of contest.
All participants <u>MUST BE PRESENT</u> at time of kit purchase.
Tasting kits will not be sold to contestants.
All participants must be 14 and older.

STATE FAIR THEMED COOKIE JAR Division 3593

Jar should contain an assortment of 4 - 7 different types of homemade cookies.

Jar should be an attractive wide-mouthed cookie jar, of approximately one-gallon capacity.

Total height of entry may be no more than 24".

Jar should be decorated with the 2023 theme, **'The Place To Be in '23'**. Bring one of each kind of cookie, <u>including recipes</u>, in a small box for the judges to taste.

Jar decoration will count for 60% and cookies 40%.

CANNED ENTRY GUIDELINES

The Oklahoma State Fair canning judges use the National Center for Home Food Preservation Guidelines for judging guidelines which can be found at https://nchfp.uga.edu/how/general.html.

For health and safety purposes, Oklahoma State Fair judges do not open entries and are able to judge canned items by color, texture, tilting of jellies, and how well entry is packed in container. Dried items and honey are the only two classes that are the exception to this rule.

Before turning canned entries in, please check sealing of can or item will be disqualified. Any waste due to faulty canning or weather conditions is at the exhibitor's risk.

As a reminder, Canning Items will be turned in Saturday, August 26 from 10 a.m. -4 p.m. or Sunday, August 27 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m.Canning items will be judged Monday, August 28. Canning will not be accepted at any other time.

Only clean **regulation pint or quart canning jars** without any kind of label will be accepted, except for classes 13 and 14, which must be labeled. Canning exhibits do not need recipes. Any waste due to faulty canning or weather conditions is at the exhibitor's risk.

We all know that breakfast is the most important meal of the day, but did you know that eggs are the perfect choice for breakfast? The protein in eggs provides steady and sustained energy that starts your day off right! Recipes in this contest must be a breakfast dish and must contain at least one (1) egg per serving, not including garnish. Entries should be brought to the Fair already prepared for judging.

All entries will be judged on nutritional quality, ease of preparation, taste appeal, appearance and creativity.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for state competition, contestant must have won Champion, Reserve Champion or Bread Machine Class at their County "Best of Wheat" competition. If there is minimal participation at County level and the same person wins Champion, Reserve Champion or Bread Machine Class with two different entries in two different classes that person may enter both entries at State level.

All class determinations will be at the discretion of the Oklahoma Wheat Commission, no matter how they were entered or judged at the county level. If any part of the recipe is done with a bread machine, then the recipe will be classified in the bread machine category.

First Place recipes at the 2022 State Contest are ineligible to compete.

Bread Machine entries will not be eligible for Grand Champion or the silver tray award. 1st through 5th place ribbons will be awarded to the bread machine class in both divisions at the State contest.

Each entry must be prepared and baked by the person whose name is on the entry form. Winning recipes at County level must be duplicated at State Contest.

Recipe must accompany entry at state level. Recipes must state what type of flour is utilized, meaning brand & classification, wheather whole wheat, bread, all-purpose, hard red or white flour. For publication purposes brand of yeast and whether it is active or instant should also be specified.

Any container used to present entry must be disposable and encouraged to look nice if possible for photographs for OWC cookbook.

Participants are responsible for entering their own products at the Oklahoma State Fair or making arrangements for someone else to enter the product. Duplicate recipes may not be entered by different family members in any class or division.

A duplicate of winner's baked bread that won on county level must be brought to the Cooking Department at the Creative Arts Building on Sunday, September 24, 2023 between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. NO late check-ins. JUDGING WILL BEGIN AT 1 p.m. Only whole loaves of bread may be entered. NO HALF LOAVES.

Deadline for submitting state entry form to be last day of county fair. Send to: Oklahoma Wheat Commission, 8820 Silver Hill Drive, Oklahoma City, OK 73132. Entry forms to be completed by County Extension Educator or Fair Coordinator.

The only foods which will be displayed will be the Grand Champion of each division. All participants must pick up their entries immediately after the presentation of the Grand Champion awards. No entries will be retained after 4:30 p.m. NO PRODUCT WILL BE RELEASED UNTIL GRAND CHAMPION AWARD PRESENTATIONS ARE MADE.

Awards will be presented immediately following judging. Premiums are provided by the Oklahoma Wheat Commission.

Whole Wheat Breads Class #2 – This category will include only the use of whole wheat flour and/or a whole white wheat flour. NO All-purpose flour or Bread Flour included in this category. Dough enhancers, vital wheat gluten and whole grains, in addition to whole wheat, are permissible.

Dinner rolls should consist of three (3) rolls per entry. Any shape is acceptable.

The OTHER WHEAT BREADS, class #4 and #9 will include other breads made with yeast such as cheese. French, onion, sourdough, challah, etc.

NO QUICK BREADS unless yeast is used as a leavening agent. Breads must use yeast as a leavening agent.

Specialty Shapes Class #11 - Let your imagination go: animals, people, objects, etc. All garnishes must be edible. Twists and star breads should be entered in the "other wheat breads" or "sweet breads" category and not specialty shapes.
