
Schedule for free registration: July 1 at 10 a.m. through August 15

FREE REGISTRATION MUST BE DONE ONLINE. If you do not have computer access, please go to your local library or contact your local OSU Cooperative Extension Services.


Late registration: We no longer accept late registration, but we will have on-site registration during take-in.

On-site registration: August 23, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and August 24, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Exhibitors will be charged a \$12 fee per exhibitor (not per entry). **Credit or Debit cards will only be accepted.**

June 1	New competition guides posted online.
July 1	Online registration opens at 10 a.m.
August 15	Entry deadline for the Oklahoma State Fair Creative Arts competitions and contests. Free registrations must be received online by August 15.
August 16	We will no longer accept late online registrations, but you will be able to register on site during take-in with a small fee of \$12 per exhibitor. <u>All entries</u> will be turned in on the listed check-in days/ live contest.
August 23	<u>Entry clerks will receive canning items</u> at the Oklahoma Arts Building from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee per exhibitor done electronically.
August 24	<u>Entry clerks will receive canning items</u> at the Oklahoma Arts Building from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee per exhibitor done electronically.
August 25	All canned items will be judged. This is closed judging. Exhibitors are not permitted to attend. We encourage you to come to the Fair to view results. Judging results will be posted online as soon as they are available, possibly after the end of the State Fair. Do not call or email to ask for results. They cannot be given out prior to posting.
September 6	<u>Entry clerks will receive all other non-canned cooking</u> items at the Oklahoma Arts Building from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee done electronically.
September 7	<u>Entry clerks will receive all other non-canned cooking</u> items at the Oklahoma Arts Building from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Late registration will be available to enter with a \$12 late registration fee per exhibitor done electronically.
September 11	Oklahoma State Fair opens! The Oklahoma Arts Building will host a series of demonstrations, live contests, and special events every day of the Fair.
September 21	Last day of the Oklahoma State Fair.
September 22	Entry clerks will release exhibits upon presentation of claim check at the Oklahoma Arts Building from 2 to 7 p.m.
September 23	Entry clerks will release exhibits upon presentation of claim check at the Oklahoma Arts Building from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Items not picked up become property of the Oklahoma State Fair.

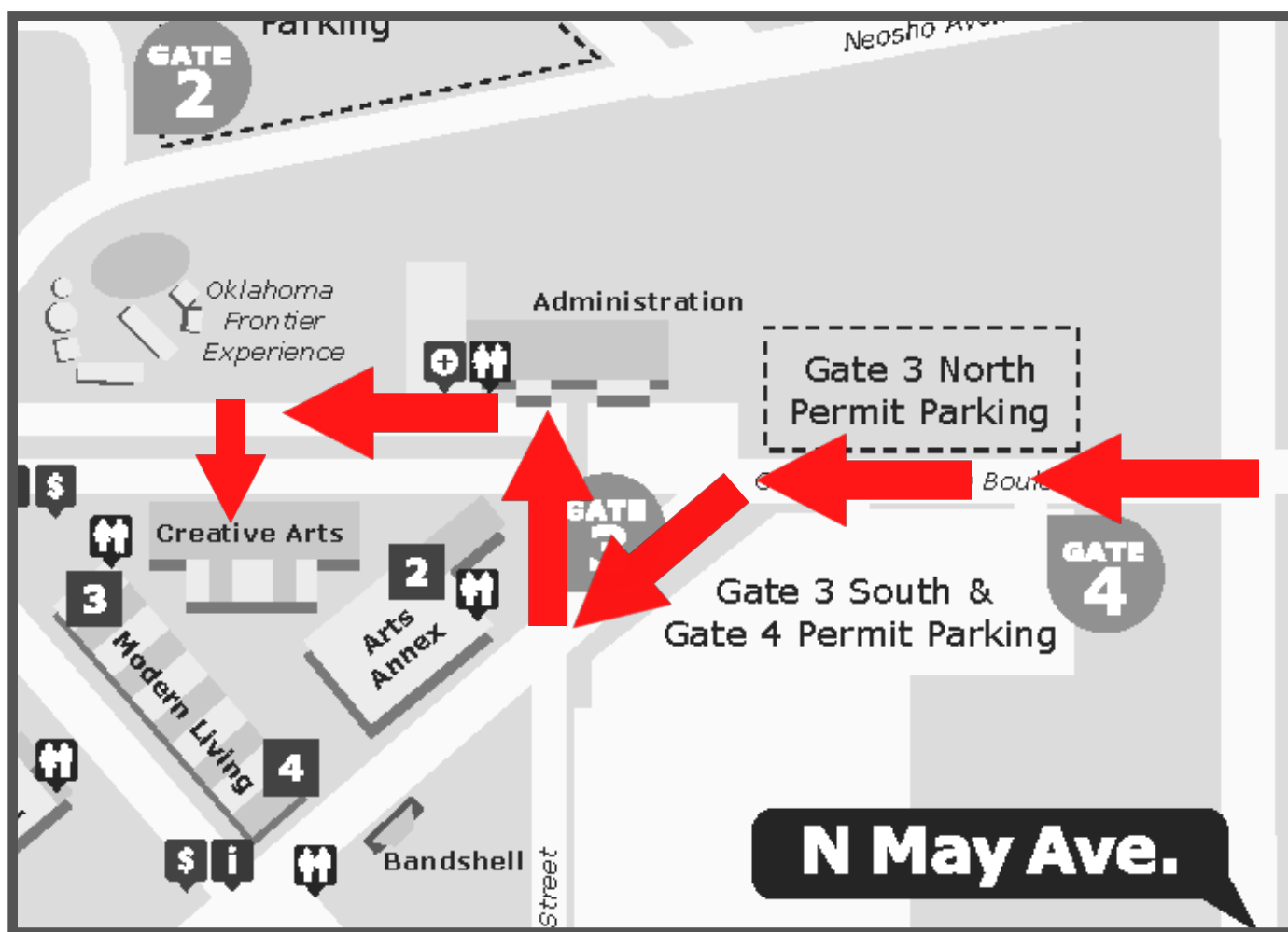

How To Get Here: Pre-Fair

Our physical address is 3100 General Pershing Blvd, OKC, OK 73107.

From I-44 take the NW 10th St. eastbound exit and follow until NW 10th St. and May Ave. (2nd light). Turn right onto May Ave. Proceed to Gate 3 (1st light) and drive towards the gate. You will then enter the OKC Fairgrounds and make your way to the Oklahoma Arts Building.

Drop-Off Information

For **Canning**: Drop-off is Saturday, August 23 from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. and Sunday, August 24 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. At check-in you will be given a claim check tag. PLEASE SAVE THESE as they are what you will need to pick up your item(s). Canning will only be accepted these days.

For all other **Pre-Fair Contests**: Drop-off is Saturday, September 6 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. and Sunday, September 7 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. At check-in you will be given a claim check tag. PLEASE SAVE THESE as they are what you will need to pick up your item(s). Canning **WILL NOT** be accepted this weekend.

Pick Up Information

Pick up is Monday, September 22 from 2 - 7 p.m. and Tuesday, September 23 from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. Please remember to bring your claim check tag as this is how you reclaim your pieces. If you have misplaced your claim check tag, please bring a current photo ID of the exhibitor.

CREATIVE ARTS RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRY INFORMATION

Who Can Enter? ONLY OKLAHOMA RESIDENTS may enter our contests. Exhibitors entering must be amateurs unless an Open (expert) Division is offered.

Who is considered an Amateur? Someone who earns less than 10% of their income from this skill. If you have taught this craft before, or currently teach, you are not considered an Amateur, but may enter in an open class, if available.

Are there any size limitations? Furniture may be no larger than 40" in any direction. All other exhibits are limited to 30" in any direction.

How many exhibits can be entered? ONE ENTRY PER CLASS (unless otherwise stated.) There is no limit on the total number of entries. Photography is the exception with 12 total entries allowed per exhibitor. All entries must have been completed since the final day of the previous Oklahoma State Fair.

Can I enter something I have entered in the past? Unless otherwise specified, items can only be entered once.

What is the cost to enter? CREATIVE ARTS ENTRIES ARE FREE if registered by August 15. (Only the wine contest requires an entry fee.)

May I mail in my exhibit? No.

Do I need to pre-register for live contests? Yes. All registration is online and you cannot register the day of on-site.

How do I get into the Fair if I am entered in a live contest? **ONLY EXHIBITORS** receive FREE ENTRY AND PARKING with live contests. Family and friends will need to purchase a ticket to get in the day of the contest. Please check out our pre-sale of tickets starting in July and ending the day before the start of the Fair.

All entries must be the work of the exhibitor and completed since the previous Oklahoma State Fair except as noted.

CREATIVE ARTS DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS

- The Oklahoma State Fair reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered if it is objectionable in any way, if it requires an excessive amount of space, or if the capacity of the department has been reached. Any contest may be cancelled for lack of entries.
- Each item turned in is completed by one person, unless otherwise noted in the competition information.
- All work must be original. Art reproduced or rendered from works of masters, from advertisements, materials from published sources, or from widely circulated photographs is not original. AI art is not allowed, unless specified by the rules.
- Your items will be handled with care, however, Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. is not responsible for items that are damaged or lost while on display during the Fair. If the exhibitor feels it necessary, they must purchase their own insurance at their own expense. Exhibitors MAY NOT supply their own display stands. Only OSF stands will be used for display.
- Each exhibit will be evaluated by qualified individuals and the decision of the judge(s) is final. All cash prizes will be paid from the awards as marked by the judges and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. Judges are instructed not to award cash prizes unless the exhibit is deemed worthy of the placing awarded. Premium payouts for the Creative Arts Department will be mailed to exhibitors after the close of the Fair.
- Within 90 days from the last day of the 2025 Oklahoma State Fair, it is the responsibility of the Payee to file, in writing, a claim for lost or incorrect awards.
- If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made any false statement with regards to any article or exhibit, or if any exhibitor attempts to harass or interfere with the judge or judges in the performance of their duties, the exhibitor shall be excluded from competition and forfeit all premiums.
- Any protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Said protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be filed with the Creative Programs Manager by 5 p.m. on Thursday of the closing week of the Fair. Judges will be encouraged to view exhibits after items have been placed on display with names. If they believe that an exhibitor is not in the correct skill level, that judge will be encouraged to protest the placement.
- Every effort will be made to display entries in an attractive arrangement; however, items entered for competition will be displayed through 3rd place. Other entries will be displayed only as space is available and at the discretion of the superintendents.

COOKING DEPARTMENT RULES & GUIDELINES

- Canned items turn-in is Saturday, August 23 & Sunday, August 24. Canning items will only be accepted then. All other non-live cooking items will be turned in Saturday, September 6 & Sunday, September 7. All items not to be displayed during the Fair will be available for pick up on Tuesday, September 9 from 2 - 5 p.m. or after the Fair during reclaim hours.
- DO NOT MAIL YOUR PRINTED RECIPES. Recipes must accompany each exhibit when it is entered. Please use the OSF Standard Recipe Template, if possible. The template is on the last page of this guide. It is also a fillable form on the webpage. If you choose to type the recipe on your own paper, please BE SURE the format is the same and it is on plain white paper with no frills or decoration on the page.
- For food safety, all ingredients, equipment and garnishes must be transported in clear plastic containers and/or storage tubs. All entries must be brought to the Fair on disposable plates, pans and boards. No baskets, cardboard boxes or any other type of opaque container will be permitted for ingredients, equipment or garnishes. No exceptions. Prepared dishes such as casseroles and pies may be brought in the container in which they were cooked. Thermal carriers for hot dishes and ice chests for cold items are permissible. Glass dishes/pans may be used in live contests except where noted otherwise. Entries will not be accepted if displayed in baskets.
- Articles will be juried to the satisfaction of the judge. Live contest entries will not be released until the contest is over.
- Cooking items placing lower than 3rd and canning items placing lower than 5th may be picked up the Tuesday before the Fair between 2 - 5 p.m. Results will not be known by the Creative Programs Manager at this time to give information over the phone. Perishable food items and containers will be disposed of after this window while canning items will be stored until after the Fair for pick up.

NOTE: ALL BAKED GOODS BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR AND WILL BE REMOVED WHEN SPOILED. RECIPES BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR AND THEIR SPONSORS, INCLUDING PUBLICATION RIGHTS.

PEOPLE'S CHOICE RULES

- Only cash accepted.
- Tasting kits are sold when contest starts, except crock pot, which is 30 minutes before the start of contest.
- All participants MUST BE PRESENT at time of kit purchase. One kit per person in line. Additional kits cannot be purchased.
- Tasting kits will not be sold to contestants.
- All participants must be 14 and older.

Santa Claus is comin' to town! Or at least, he's preparing to come to town.

Decorate a plate fit for Santa to leave for him as he shimmies down the chimney. Plates will need to include 5 – 6 different types of homemade holiday cookies. Plate must be decorated at home and not store bought. Diameter/length of the plate/tray cannot be more than 12" and any additional decorations cannot exceed more than 2" making display 14".

Bring one of each kind of cookie, including recipes, in a small box for the judges to taste.

Plate decoration will count for 60% and cookies 40%.

Jar should contain an assortment of 4 - 7 different types of homemade cookies.

Jar should be an attractive wide-mouthed cookie jar, of approximately one-gallon capacity. The jar can be decorated, but base must be clear so cookies can be seen.

Total height of entry may be no more than 24" and cookie jar must have the ability to open.

Jar should be decorated with the 2025 theme, **'Eat, Ride, Repeat'**. Bring one of each kind of cookie, including recipes, in a small box for the judges to taste.

Jar decoration will count for 60% and cookies 40%.

Previous year winner cannot compete.

No fresh fruit garnishes or fruit fillings will be allowed. Fillings only allowed in class 13. Cakes requiring refrigeration WILL NOT be accepted.

Do not bring cakes in pans. No box mixes except CLASSES 01 & 02.

CANNED ENTRY GUIDELINES

The Oklahoma State Fair canning judges use the National Center for Home Food Preservation Guidelines for judging guidelines which can be found at <https://nchfp.uga.edu/how/general.html>.

For health and safety purposes, Oklahoma State Fair judges do not open entries and are able to judge canned items by color, texture, tilting of jellies, and how well entry is packed in container. Dried items and honey are the only two classes that are the exception to this rule.

Before turning canned entries in, please make sure jars are CLEAN and lids are without rust. Lids need to be two-piece consisting of a flat & a ring. Please check sealing of can or item will be disqualified. Any waste due to faulty canning or weather conditions is at the exhibitor's risk.

As a reminder, Canning Items will be turned in Saturday, August 23 from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. or Sunday, August 24 from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. Canning items will be judged during that week. Canning will not be accepted at any other time.

CANNED FRUITS Division 3597

Only clean **regulation pint or quart canning jars** without any kind of label will be accepted, except for classes 13 and 14, which must be labeled. Canning exhibits do not need recipes. Any waste due to faulty canning or weather conditions is at the exhibitor's risk.

Because of this, we are asking you to create a baked good substituting the sweetener for honey! Either use a tried & true recipe or create a new one using honey as a minimum of 50% of the sweetener.

How do you do that? Replace 1 cup of sugar with 2/3 cups of honey in the recipe. Also, as a tip, reduce your other liquids in the recipe by 1/4 a cup for each cup of honey used since honey has water in it! Thirdly, lower your baking temperature by 25°. Also, if there's already another acidic ingredient in the recipe, add 1/4 teaspoon of baking soda when you use honey (buttermilk, molasses or banana!). By doing this, you should have a perfect substitution for sugar!

As a final tip - spray your measuring tools with cooking spray before measuring out the honey so it will slide out easily!

Any container used to present entry must be disposable and encouraged to look nice as possible for cookbook photographs. Participants are responsible for entering their own products at the State Fair or making arrangements for someone else to enter the product.

(Duplicate recipes may not be entered by different family members in any class or division.)
