- ❖ Therapeutic Riding Centers OR exhibitors entering independently MUST complete and return the Request for Credentials form with their entries to be submitted to the OSF by August 15. Failure to complete and return this form may result in having to purchase admissions/parking upon arrival.
- ❖ No horses will be allowed entrance outside of the dates and hours noted below.

ENTRY DEADLINE: Hard copy/completed entries will be accepted through [must be received by] August 15, 2026. No late entries will be accepted. No refunds for cancellations.

(Some with regard to entry procedures, requirements, refunds, late & post entries may not be applicable to this show/event). **These rules and guidelines contain important information regarding gate/arrival hours, animal health information and documentation, contact information and more that will be important to and applicable to this event.** It is important that you read thoroughly, understand, enter and comply with all rules pertinent to Oklahoma State Fair Horse Shows as listed on pages preceding show information and as available on the website. Your submission of entries and presence at OKC Fair Park indicates your understanding, acceptance and agreement of all rules published pertinent to this and other equine competitions held in conjunction with the 2026 Oklahoma State Fair. This includes release of all liability for all guests, exhibitors, owners, assistants volunteers and associates and agreement to all rules and guidelines published relative to this event.

1) **EXHIBITOR'S WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY:**

By completing and submitting any/all entries into any OSF competition, all individuals associated with any contestant, exhibitor, owner, coach, assistant, guest and/or animal(s) hereby releases, discharges and agrees to indemnify Oklahoma State Fair, Inc., the City of Oklahoma City, and the City of Oklahoma City Public Property Authority (and all of their officers, directors, members, managers, agents, representatives and employees) ("Indemnified Parties") from any and all losses or expenses of any kind, civil penalties, crimes, and causes of actions (including cost for defense, settlement and attorney fees) arising from or related to (1) death or bodily injury to any person, (2) destruction, damage, loss of theft of any property, (3) any violation of any law or (4) any other claim, cause of action, damage or expense, which results from or arises out of any act or failure to act, claim, demand or action arising from or by reason of personal injury that may occur to any associated individual(s) or animal(s) or properties entered or attending this Event being

held at OKC Fair Park (OKCFP), whether caused by the actual or passive negligence of the Releasees, while aforementioned individual(s) are at OKCFP and/or competing, observing, working in, or for any purposes participating at the Oklahoma State Fair. All associates as mentioned herein voluntarily agree to the release and waiver of liability and indemnity agreement as indicated by their submission of entries and their presence at OKCFP. All involved individuals are aware of and understand Oklahoma Statutes, Section 50 of Title 76 pertaining to the Oklahoma Livestock Liability Limitations Act. The person submitting these entries, therein agrees to accept authority to act as agent for actual and/or recorded owner(s) of any/all animal(s) being entered, if applicable, and, in doing so, indicates acceptance of all rules, regulations, liability limitations for all individuals so named as owner, trainer, coach, agent, exhibitor, rider, handler, groom, guest and/or showman. The person submitting these entries accepts responsibility and verifies accuracy of all information provided herein. This release and waiver shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

- 2) The **OSF Equine Empowerment Horse Show Entry Form, the Participants Guarantee of Medical Release Form, the Instructor/Coach Confirmation Form, the Credential Request form, the Oklahoma State Fair Liability Waiver/Release form and the Veteran Exhibitor Eligibility Form (for veteran exhibitors) (pages 9-14) MUST** be completed for all exhibitors, associates, guests, volunteers, coaches, and instructors and **returned for receipt with applicable total fees** no later than August 15, 2026 to: Oklahoma State Fair, Inc., Re: Equine Empowerment Horse Show, 3001 General Pershing Blvd., Oklahoma City OK 73107. Any exhibitors with an account balance will not be allowed in the competition arena.
- 3) The minimum age of exhibitors/competitors shall be at least 8 (eight) years of age as of September 22, 2026.
- 4) All handlers/exhibitors are required to wear or display OSF provided back number(s) when entering the competition arena. Entries will not be allowed into the show arena without this exhibitor/back number. Not wearing or displaying the correct number may void exhibitor placing.
- 5) Medical personnel will be on the grounds from 8 a.m. – 10 p.m.
- 6) Exhibitors, trainers, and coaches will be allowed to school/practice on Monday, September 21 after the conclusion of the event being held that day in the Performance Arena and prior to 10 p.m. in select and specified arenas.
- 7) **Use of individual/private owned golf carts or other similar motorized transport within OKC Fair Park gates is strictly prohibited. Golf cart usage will not be considered or allowed without OSF written application, detailed insurance certificate, permit fees and authorization. Minors without a valid driver's license are not allowed to operate any motorized vehicle.** Contact OSF horse show management for more information.
- 8) **ADMISSION/PARKING:**
Exhibitors or a representative of their therapeutic riding centers will need to check in at the Horse Show office upon arrival for stall assignments and to pick up exhibitor back numbers, etc. Admission tickets and parking permits will be mailed prior to the Fair to the individual exhibitor OR the entering TRC. It will be the therapeutic riding center's responsibility to distribute to staff/associates/volunteers, etc. Subject to limitations.
- 9) Each individual exhibitor entered, with entries submitted and **received no later than August 15, 2026**, will be given 3 (three) single day admission tickets for each of two days and two (2) single day parking pass for those arriving Monday, September 21 and competing/participating Tuesday, September 22. (This allows one vehicle parking for each of 2 days in any lot designated "Paid Parking"). The parking permit is not good for gate admission, and it does not guarantee a parking place. Subject to availability and rules as stated on the permit. An additional/limited quantity of single day parking permits will be allocated to the therapeutic riding centers staff and volunteers but "car pooling" and ride sharing and the purchase of additional parking permits available on the OK State Fair website is strongly encouraged.
- 10) **The Credential Request Form included herein (page 12) with the entry documents MUST be completed in entirety and returned with the other entry documents by August 15 to allow for adequate admission and parking permits to be created and distributed to the responsible Therapeutic Riding Center or independent exhibitor entering individually.**
- 11) **Additional ticket/admission and/or parking permit needs must be purchased in advance through the OK State Fair website OR at the gate upon arrival.** (Refer to <https://okstatefair.com/information/hours-admissions/> for additional information regarding advance/other discount ticket options.
- 12) We encourage you to take advantage of the **Special Discount Ticket Days** and additional admission/parking information available at <https://okstatefair.com/information/hours-admissions/>
- 13) **STALLS:** Stalls are mandatory for each individual horse duly entered and being used in this competition. Horses cannot be shown out of trailers or maintained at OKCFP outside of stalls. No horses can be brought to the Fair that are not entered or being used in this competition.

IMPORTANT: Be aware of the current equine health documentation required prior to arrival. See Health and Sanitary Regulations on OSF Equine Competitions website, along with General Rules/Guidelines and visit: [EIA-Test-Handout.pdf \(ok.gov\)](#). Horses will not be allowed at OKCFP without current, complete and appropriate documentation as noted therein, which **MUST** be presented upon arrival to the Health Inspectors at Gate 7 during the hours of arrival noted on the first page of this document.

- a) Three (3) bags of bedding for each entered horse/stall will be provided compliments of the Oklahoma State Fair. Feed & Bedding: OKC Fair Park has a no outside bedding policy. The individual exhibitor may be charged \$5 per bag if an exhibitor brings in additional and/or excessive bedding. An onsite feed and bedding store is available for exhibitor convenience. Questions about this policy can be directed to the Feed & Bedding Department at OKC Fair Park (405) 948-6786. Exhibitors may bring in the feed of their choice.
 - b) Additional tack/equipment stalls will be allowed and allocated to the riding center as requested on the Instructor/Coach Confirmation form and is based on the number of horses they will be bringing for competition. (1 stall per 3-4 individual horses entered by each individual center).
 - c) **NO revision, disassembly or dismantling of stalls.** Refer to General Rules for policies regarding use of stalls.
- 14) **CLASS ENTRY FEE:** \$7.00 per class/per exhibitor must be paid with check made payable to the Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. and mailed for receipt no later than August 15, 2026. Mail the **all forms noted in item 2) (pages 9-14) on the previous page** to: Oklahoma State Fair, Inc., Attn: Equine Empowerment Horse Show, 3001 General Pershing Blvd., Oklahoma City OK 73107. **DO NOT MAIL OR INCLUDE EQUINE COGGINS CERTIFICATE OR EQUINE HEALTH DOCUMENTS** – those forms **must** arrive with the horse(s) at Gate 7 during the allowed horse arrival hours noted on page 1 of this document. Late/post entries cannot be accepted. Incomplete entries: those lacking all requested documents or those received after August 15, 2026 may be returned and denied. There will be no refunds for incomplete or cancelled entries.
- 15) **START/SESSION TIMES/LUNCH/DINNER BREAKS SUBJECT TO REVISION:** Oklahoma State Fair Horse Show management reserves the right to revise start times and show locations for all classes as well as combine classes after close of entries. Please re-visit the Oklahoma State Fair website and check with the horse show office to determine any additional information or possible changes available after September 1, 2026. All efforts will be made to provide more precise starting times. Listen carefully for announcements and updates.
- 16) **Awards** will be given in each class: 1st through 6th place. **NEW IN 2026:** A special Oklahoma State Fair High Point award will be given to the therapeutic riding center with multiple students/clients entered by the specific TRC in entirety no later than August 15, 2026. Points will be awarded to each entered individual based on his/her placing and the total number of individuals entered, shown and judged in each class.
- 17) Classes with more than 6 entries, received in entirety no later than August 15, 2026 and confirmed to show by September 15 may be split. Be aware of the PATH rules regarding horse use and the schedule for additional classes due to splits/additional heats and exhibitor assignments for each split.
- 18) Competitors will be mounted and dismounted by instructors/coaches and there will be a safety inspection of tack and equipment performed by each center for their own competitors, before competitors mount. A mounting ramp (with a weight limit of no more than 750 pounds) and a three step mounting block will be available for use in the warm up arena in Barn 7.
- 19) Anticipate a coach's/instructor's/exhibitor's meeting to be called Monday, September 21 p.m. Listen for announcements as to exact time and location.
- 20) An individual with Down Syndrome who has shown a positive Atlanto-axial instability test may not participate in this competition.
- 21) Stallions cannot be brought to OKCFP nor shown in any class in this competition.
- 22) Each exhibitor/competitor (whether mounted or on ground) must be accompanied by an instructor, coach and/or volunteer in the warmup or holding area(s) or while holding in preparation for entry into any class or while schooling.
- 23) **DIVISIONS/LEVELS:** Exhibitors must determine, select and enter the appropriate division and cannot cross enter between the EQUESTRIANS WITH DISABILITIES (EWD) division and the VETERANS division. EXCEPTION: The Barrel Racing classes are open to all eligible exhibitors. Classes will be listed as EWD__ or V__, followed by the available levels for each class offered.
- ❖ Exhibitors/competitors may enter any or all classes permitted for their divisions, but may not cross enter division levels. E.g. Exhibitors showing in Walk/Jog or Walk/Trot classes cannot additionally enter in the Walk/Jog/Lope and/or Walk/Trot/Canter classes.

EQUESTRIANS WITH DISABILITIES DIVISION: Exhibitors/competitors in the EWD division of this event/show are assigned to a specific division according to their ability to safely negotiate any movements required in the class. Definitions of levels for the EWD classes are:

- A. Walk/Trot (or) Jog/Lope (or) Canter: (3 gaits) Independent competitor only.
- B. Walk/Trot (or) Jog: (2 gaits) Independent competitor only.
- C. Walk/Trot (or) Walk/Jog: (2 gaits) Supported: 1-3 assistants utilized/allowed.
- D. Walk/Only: Independent competitor only.
- E. Walk Only: Supported: 1-3 assistants utilized/allowed.

Exhibitors in the EWD division classes cannot cross enter into the Veterans' Division: EXCEPTION: Barrel Races: open to both divisions.

VETERANS DIVISION: NON-SUPPORTED

Criteria:

- ❖ Exhibitors/Riders in the Veterans Division/Classes must be disabled veterans or active duty "wounded warriors" who are participating in PATH Intl. Equine Services for Heroes programs, or have a Department of Veterans Affairs Disability rating.
- ❖ The individual's PATH facilities/therapeutic riding centers will be responsible for verifying the eligibility of riders participating in the Veterans Division/Classes. Veterans cannot cross enter classes between the EQUESTRIANS WITH DISABILITIES division and VETERANS division. EXCEPTION: The Barrel Racing classes are open to all eligible and entered exhibitors.
- ❖ For disabled veterans who do not participate in a therapeutic riding program/center, the Department of Veteran Affairs letter recording the dates of service, the service-connected disability rating and the date it was awarded must be provided immediately with entries or mailed in with postmark by entry closing date. Please black out all other personal information included in that document, such as social security number, monthly award, etc. prior to submission to the OK State Fair.
- ❖ All other rules applicable to the EWD/VETERANS Division/Classes, and/or OK State Fair General Rules/Guidelines and rules pertinent to equine health requirements/documentation apply.

COMPETITION ARMBANDS: Exhibitors/Competitors must wear colored armbands (provided by each center) if they wish to identify any special needs during the competition:

Yellow = Non posting trot (unable to physically post)

Red = Visual impairment

Blue = Hearing impairment

Green = Non verbal

Exhibitors/Competitors not wearing armbands may not protest the Judge's decision due to a disability. It is the responsibility of the competitor's coach/instructor/center to provide/supply and apply/fit the appropriate armband.

TACK/EQUIPMENT GUIDELINES

Adaptive equipment:

- a) Break away rubber bands no larger than ½" may be worn by competitors that require help to keep their feet in the stirrup (one per foot).
- b) Approved velcro "sticky seats" are acceptable.
- c) Shoelaces or alternative fasteners may attach stirrup/leathers to girth for competitors that need leg stability
- d) Adaptive tack must be approved pre-show at coaches meeting.

General:

- a) Saddles must fit the horse and competitor well.
- b) Halters: All horses when ridden must wear a halter in a manner that does not interfere with reining of the horse. A halter must be on the horse either over or under the bridle, for use by the handler if needed.
- c) Lead line may be used and not be attached to bit, but may be attached to cavesson, noseband, sidepull or halter.
- d) PROHIBITED TACK and equipment (applies to the warm-up area as well as competition):
 - Running Martingales or martingales of any kind
 - Bearing, side or running reins
 - Tie downs
 - Draw reins
 - Wire/metal/rawhide devices as part of the chin-strap
 - Shoes other than standard horse shoes.

- e) Competitors may use adaptive equipment without penalty but they may in no way be “attached” to the horse or saddle and must be declared.
- f) Bridles must be appropriate to the class entered and meet the rule requirements. A judge at his/her own discretion can penalize a horse with non-conventional types of bits or nosebands.
- g) Earplugs and/or ear protection are permitted/allowed but must be declared prior to entry into the arena.

English Equitation

- a) English type saddle is required
- b) Regulation snaffles and/or pelhams with cavesson recommended
- c) Spurs and crops are optional

Western Equitation and/or Trail (ridden)

- a) Western type saddle is required. It may be slick or swelled fork and have a high or low cantle.
- b) Bits and Bridles – A standard western bit, defined as having a shank with a maximum length overall of 21 cm (8 ½”). The mouthpiece will consist of a metal bar 75MM (3/8”) to 3 cm (3/4”) in diameter, varying from the straight bar to a jointed mouthpiece. Nothing may extend below the horizontal plane of the mouthpiece other than a roller attached to the center of the bit. Swivel ports and flat polo mouthpieces are permitted. Reins must be attached to each shank. Regulation snaffles and bit-less bridles are allowed.
- c) Optional equipment – Silver equipment may be used but should not be given preference over good working equipment
- d) Spurs and crops are optional

Showmanship or Trail In Hand

- a) Competitors showing horses under Western tack style may use a halter and lead shank made of leather or nylon.
- b) Competitors showing horses under English tack style may use a suitable English bridle or halter either of leather or nylon.

COMPETITOR ATTIRE

The following attire requirements must be adhered to for mounted competitors:

- a) Western tack style - competitors must wear hard soled boots with a heel and use peacock stirrups, tapaderos or some other type of safety stirrups, or western stirrups 2” wide.
- b) English tack style - competitors must wear hard soled boots/shoes with a heel and use peacock stirrups, S-shaped irons, quick out stirrups, devonshire boots or other safety stirrups.
- c) Competitors that must wear other footwear as stated in (a) and (b) above as the result of a physical disability must have a physician’s statement submitted with their entry form.
- d) All competitors must wear protective ASTM-SEI approved helmets with full chin harness which must be fastened at all times they are riding or working around the horses.
- e) Competitors must wear their numbers prominently displayed on their back during competition and while in the “holding areas” during competition.
- f) During practice, competitors must adhere to the helmet, boot and long pants rule but may wear short sleeves.

English Competitor Attire:

- a) A dark colored riding jacket appropriate for the style of riding/competition
- b) A solid color, preferably white, riding shirt or oxford style long or short sleeve shirt
- c) Tie or choker
- d) Breeches or jodhpurs
- e) Gloves are optional
- f) Competitors will be permitted to wear a helmet cover

Western Competitor Attire:

- a) Jeans or long pants
- b) A long sleeved shirt – show quality or conservative long sleeved
- c) A belt under loops
- d) Chaps are prohibited in showmanship classes
- e) Competitors will be permitted to wear a helmet cover

REMINDER:

*Equitation and Horsemanship classes are divided by “Rail Work Only” and “Pattern Work”. The “Rail Work Only” classes will not include any individual pattern work and will be “group” classes and the Pattern Work classes will be just that: patterns alone and performed singularly/individually.

*Check the OK State Fair Equine Competitions/Equine Empowerment Horse Show site for selected patterns which will be posted/available as we get closer to the Fair.

Please note that the class list provided herein is in chronological order and is the actual class order. Make sure that you only enter the class(es) you/your horse(s) are eligible to show in. START TIMES FOR EACH SESSION MAY BE REVISED AFTER CLOSE OF ENTRIES. Classes with insufficient entries may be combined. Classes with more than 6 (six) entries may be split into multiple heats to run concurrently. Class splits will be determined after entries are received. A one hour lunch break will start approximately 12 p.m. noon and arena drag breaks will be scheduled and announced at the discretion of Judge and Show Management.
